Thank you for the meeting last night. I appreciate the care and research the city has put into the Stewart Road project. But I was confused about what was in Options 1 and 2.

I thought Option 1 included a number of traffic tables (or humps, or bumps, etc.). But by the end of the meeting it sounded like Option 1 meant a "climbing" bike lane and only one traffic slowing area. If so, I don't like this option. Also, having biked on Stewart for 40 years, I'm not impressed with a bike lane on only one side of the street. I think the term "climbing bike lane" is a misnomer and it should be called a single bike lane. And I don't see how a bike lane would really slow traffic on the downhill side into the university, though as you point out it would make the street narrower for car traffic.

So, as far as I can see now, I prefer Option 2, and like the suggestion of something at W. Parkway (and Westmount) to facilitate entry into the park.

While I was unable to attend the meeting last week, I was on the mailing list for all the subsequent emails between you and Tim Materer. I wish to address one point that you made in an email to Tim.

"Create a chicaning effect since the centerline of the road would change throughout the road, slowing the traffic. "

I feel fairly confident in predicting that this would not occur. I go to my company (in the MU Research Park) by going down West to Stadium. Cars regularly go over the line into the bike lane (on the south bound side) since this gives them more room on their side of the road. Disregarding the center lane also happens on S. Providence, at the turn in the road where it crosses Rollins (going north). One needs to shift right to stay within the proper lane. A huge percent of vehicles (including large trucks) cross the double line, entering into the south bound left turn lane. So why would anyone believe in a chicaning effect on W. Stewart?

Thank you for the feedback. I would like to clarify the climbing bike lane. Bikes traveling eastbound will always stay on the right hand side of the road as well as westbound bikes stay on the right hand side of the road. The idea is to give the bikes going up a hill (when they are traveling the slowest) a bike lane. This will allow the bike to have a dedicated space on the road while going up hill as well as make pasing bikes easier for cars. When bikes are going down hill they will share the lane with cars as they do now.
