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

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

Forum and Green Meadows Intersection Improvements

Regarding the proposed concepts for the intersection at Forum and Green Meadows, I would highly encourage that the city consider the impact that the project will have on surrounding streets. As a resident on Canterbury Drive, which is a direct cut-thru between Forum and Green Meadows, this project will have a direct effect on my family, as well as all other neighbors on our street.

Canterbury Drive, a residential street in the northeast quadrant of the Forum/Green Meadows intersection, has constant traffic. It is used at all times of day solely to by-pass the intersection in question, with heavy usage during peak traffic times on weekday mornings and evenings, and steady usage on the weekends.

A resident on Canterbury Drive measured multiple vehicles on Canterbury Dr. at speeds over 50 MPH, double the posted speed limit. Clearly this is exceedingly unsafe for a residential road, especially one that has many families with children under 12 years old who love to play together outside. It is a tragedy in waiting... something no one would ever want.

Since this cut-thru traffic problem already exists, I would ask that potential impact to traffic on Canterbury Drive be considered during the decision making process for the Forum/Green Meadows intersection. The most concerning designs are the J Turn options. Because these limit the ability for left turns at the Forum/Green Meadows intersection they will essentially encourage the already dangerous traffic that exists on Canterbury Dr.

I would like to strongly suggest these designs NOT be used. I much prefer the roundabout design over all others. As a former resident of the Lake of the Woods area, where roundabouts are prevalent, I gained an affinity for these types of intersections due to their ease of use, ability to quickly move traffic, and their increased safety. With no potential for broadside collisions, traffic accidents are incredibly rare.

Additionally, I, and all other residents of Canterbury Drive, would like to request that the city implement traffic calming measures on our street to further discourage cut-thru traffic and reduce speeding. These measures should be installed at the beginning of the Forum/Green Meadows intersection project to reduce cut-thru traffic that would otherwise increase during construction of the intersection.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this issue. My neighbors and I look forward to working with the City to alleviate these existing traffic problems, both at the Forum/Green Meadows intersection and on Canterbury Drive.

Forum and Green Meadows Intersection Improvements July 2017

On June 27, 2017 the City of Columbia hosted an Interested Parties meeting and presented 5 concept plans for the Forum and Green Meadows Intersection Improvement project. The 5 concept plans identified were as follows:

- 1. full signal
- 2. reduced signal
- 3. J turn
- 4. J turn with Ped signal
- 5. Roundabout

Color displays of each concept were presented that included the Forum/Green Meadows intersection, Scottson Way, Augusta Drive (labeled as Country Club Villas), and Lucerne Court (unlabeled). While each of these displays indicates the conceptual design directly at the Forum/Green Meadows intersection and these listed streets, they do not display or appear to consider major traffic impacts to the nearby street we live on: Canterbury Drive. Canterbury Drive is located in the northeast quadrant of the Forum/Green Meadows intersection and provides a direct connection from Green Meadows to Forum. This connection allows drivers to bypass or "cut-thru" and avoid the Forum/Green Meadows intersection. Currently drivers use this as a cut-thru at all times of the day, with heavy usage occurring during peak traffic times in the weekday mornings and evenings, and steady usage on the weekends. Currently Canterbury Drive is wide at 37', with gentle vertical grades, and horizontally laid with a large, sweeping radius: design features that encourage cut-thrus and speeding, which is exactly what is occurring. Cut thru traffic consistently speeds thru the neighborhood at speeds well exceeding the 25 mph speed limit signs located at each end of the street (installed a few years ago by the City via request). This speeding cut-thru traffic is a danger to everyone living on the street, including at least 7 houses with children under the age of 12. The street also contains a large landscaped island just off the north side of the street that is a magnet for small children to play in, a tragedy in waiting.

Within the past 3 years a resident on the street used a City loaned radar gun and measured multiple vehicles with speeds over 50 mph, one near 60 mph.

Therefore with an established cut-thru traffic problem existing on Canterbury Drive, careful consideration of traffic impacts to Canterbury Drive from any improvements to the Forum/Green Meadows intersection (and during construction) should be considered. Of particular concern are both J turn designs. Any design limiting left turn movements at the Forum/Green Meadows intersection will simply encourage more cut thru traffic on Canterbury Drive. Therefore we would like to strongly indicate our desire for these concepts to NOT be used. We prefer the roundabout design over all conceptual designs.

We would also like to request that traffic calming measures on Canterbury Drive that discourage cutthru use and reduce speeding be added to the Forum/Green Meadows intersection project. We request that these improvements be installed at the beginning of the project, to reduce cut-thru traffic that would otherwise increase during construction in the intersection.

Thank you for this opportunity to comment. We look forward to working with the City to alleviate existing traffic problems at both the Forum/Green Meadows intersection and Canterbury Drive.

Re: Proposals for Improvement of the Forum and Green Meadow Intersection

Although we live on Canterbury Drive, rather than Forum or Green Meadows, we share the concern of other neighbors on our street about the growing amount and speed of through traffic resulting from congestion at the intersection. We have observed a steady increase in the number of vehicles using our small neighborhood street to avoid the crowded Forum and Green Meadows intersection.

Our main concern is for the several small children who frequently cross the street so they can play in the grassy circle located in the middle of the street. One or more speed bumps need to be constructed to protect these children from the many speeding vehicles that daily traverse this street.

Regarding the five options being considered, we urge selection of the "full signal" option. We believe the two J-turn options impose an unneeded inconvenience on the many people who routinely make left turns at this intersection. While the round-about option would be efficient, it would also require more space to work well and might contribute to more accidents due to its two-lane design.

Your prompt attention to our Canterbury traffic concern will be greatly appreciated.

Dear Councilman Pitzer:

I am writing to inform you that at the annual meeting of the Villas I Home Owners Association, a vote was taken in opposition to the construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Forum Blvd. and Green Meadows Rd. There are 59 residential units in our association which fronts Forum Blvd., and the larger Villas II Association lies just behind ours. Residents from both associations use the Western part of Green Meadows to enter and exit our homes.

If a roundabout is constructed at the Green Meadows and Forum intersection, we will be unable to leave our neighborhoods during high volume traffic, because there will be two lanes of traffic to our left that have the right of way. With the current system, we get an opportunity to enter the intersection. There is also a one-block street (Doral) further North that can be used sometimes during the day. However, heavy traffic also blocks our exit from this street, and if the residents from Villas II make a habit of using this street we will have heavy traffic in our now quiet community.

We appreciate your public service as our Fifth Ward Council Member, and we hope you will respect our wishes to lock for another alternative to a roundabout as a traffic solution at this crucial intersection.

My name is Bob Young @ 1206 Vintage Dr, and I am voicing my opinion regarding the traffic signals at the subject site. We do not want a roundabout at that intersection and or a j-turn. We insist you put in a full four way signal light with left turn signals.

 On Tue, Jun 27, 2017 at 4:03 PM, Jeremy C. <<u>jeremycalton@yahoo.com</u>> wrote: My wife and I lived south of that intersection for 10 years 2006-2016 and I delivered pizzas (from Domino's on Green Meadows) through that intersection from 1989 -1997.

I consider that intersection to be the worst intersection in Columbia due to the massive lanes of converging traffic and utter inability for drivers to understand the functionality of taking turns at a 4-way/All-Way stop. It's dangerous, frustrating, and inefficient. I've said since 1992 [after living in Europe] that it needs a roundabout. I have a conflict on Tuesdays at 6 pm and cannot attend today's meeting, but I do feel VERY strongly about it.

Please consider contact the Domino's and Sub Shop on Green Meadows...they waste hundreds of man-hours each month dealing with that intersection. I'm not sure if the Chinese restaurant delivers, but perhaps them, too.

P.S. Chapel Hill and Fairview is *awful* during rush hour for backing up traffic and *desperately* in need of a roundabout, but at least the intersection is orderly and not dangerous.

I should clarify that **I don't support a signal** because the intersection is only awful during rush hour. Also, I've never *ever* seen a pedestrian crossing there. Not one time. Adding a light would increase traffic delays from 3 hours a day 5 days a week [15 hours] to 24/7 [168 hours]. I would support a signal which flashed yellow for Forum and red for Green Meadows most of the week then performed standard Green/Yellow/Red during high traffic times. Possibly as long as 7:30 am to 5:30 pm, even though there's no need for that most of the day. Green Meadows does not need any priority. I say that as someone who spent over 10 years using Green Meadows trying to deliver pizzas in 30 minutes or less. Virtually all of Columbia's lights rely on camera technology (or magnetic sensors) and *constantly* stop, allowing no traffic flow and ensuring that all driving is a series of repeat stops at every single

light. The cost in fuel consumption for arbitrarily creating that much stop and go is considerable. The only major exception is the downtown lights which do not use sensors and allow E/W traffic flow prioritized over N/S.

Ms. Anderson, I have concerns about a round-about at the intersection. The traffic on Green Meadows Road is less than that on Forum Blvd. From my home. I will be east and westbound on Green Meadows Rd several times a day. Upon approaching a round-about, a driver must yield to traffic from the left (cars that have entered the round-about lanes). With 2 lanes of traffic on Forum entering the round-about, Green Meadows traffic crossing Forum will have an additional challenge of safely dealing with Forum traffic crossing Green Meadows Rd. I realize a condition that traffic northbound on Forum will be bunched some what with the traffic light at Forum and Nyfong, thus allowing Green Meadow's traffic a chance to enter the roundabout. I do not see that condition with traffic southbound on Forum. The nearest light is Chapel Hill Rd which is too far away to cause the bunching of traffic. During rush hours, waits longer than that presently being experienced now can be expected for all Green Meadows traffic. I say this because of my experiences with roundabout's wherein long lines of close-spaced vehicle traffic do not pause before entering the round-about lanes. Without some means to cause the north and southbound Forum traffic to pause, a round-about will only make traffic flow on Green Meadows worse than it is now. The question remains, is the purpose of the project to improve traffic flow on Forum to the detriment of traffic flow on Green Meadows Road? Please contact me if you have any questions. We support the roundabout as the best option for the Forum and Green Meadows intersection and believe that this project should be undertaken as soon as possible.

The city staff and public works department have invested a great deal of time and study on this project and the various options. In their judgment the roundabout is the best choice when considering safety and traffic flow issues and the cost is in the same ballpark as the other options. It seems that we city taxpayers are paying for the city staff to do their job only to have it undone by a few local residents who somehow are able to sway decision making by the city council. I would not desire to have a major construction project in my front yard either, but we really need to look at what is best for the whole community when we are dealing with a major intersection of arterial roads. It makes no sense to hire the engineers and other highly educated and experienced personnel to develop the optimal plans if this is not going to be given the proper weight by the city council when considering how to proceed.

In general we have been pleased to see more roundabouts during the 7 years we have lived in Columbia. It is apparent that as more are built, the drivers are getting much better at using them correctly. They keep traffic moving and are safe and look nice too if built well. We really can't believe that you would actually be considering a traffic light at this intersection. This would result in more cars sitting at lights wasting time and gas. The J turn options are also just adding miles to our drive every day and would likely divert traffic to side streets.

It is also noted that the Bicycle/Pedestrian Commission is in favor of the roundabout. I myself (David) will usually avoid this intersection on my bike, as I prefer to ride on the sidewalks and through the duplex area to the west in order to avoid that part of Forum Blvd for safety reasons. It seems that bike and walker safety is also going to be significantly improved and travel expedited with a roundabout.

So, please proceed with the roundabout for the benefit of all and please don't give undue weight to a few people who likely lack the knowledge and experience in these matters as compared to our paid city staff and volunteer commissions.
