Call to Order

Draft Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

Leah Christian discussed the 2018 UPWP's main priorities as follows: continue work 2045 Long-Range (LRTP), including Transportation Plan finalization of the 2045 Long-Range Plan, Financial updating long-range planning documents and identifying and establishing revised transportation goals and objectives; transportation & related land-use components of Columbia Imagined, the comprehensive land use plan for the MPA; continued emphasis on walking/bicycling modes transportation establishment bike-ped of and of count collaboration with local & regional partnerships focused traffic (Vision integration traffic non-motorized Zero); and the of safety and transportation goals, as well as other performance measures into the 2045 LRTP.

Christian stated that total FY18 UPWP Consolidated Planning Grant (CPG) program funds total \$553,874 (\$443,099 Federal/\$110,775 local match), with \$325,799 going (2 full-time positions 2.9 FTE towards salaries and in other positions). Non-salary CPG Federal share expenditures are included for the following activities:

- #130 (Long-range transportation planning): \$13,440 is programmed to pilot new bike-ped count technologies;
- #140 (Transit planning): \$12,000 is programmed to pay for a transit planning software license;
- #240 (Information Systems): \$11,860 is programmed for software/related transcription services & travel/mtg. expenses, with \$80,000 programmed for Natural Resources Inventory data processing.

Mike Henderson expressed satisfaction with the FY18 work program and discussed need complete the Appendix A contract so that the contract agreement the to process could be started. This was followed by discussion of the need to get the between the City of Columbia and MoDOT up DocuSign process and running. Ms. Christian said that her understanding was that currently the City could use DocuSign because original contracts/documents were required for all transactions, most likely due to a City ordinance. She will look into the issue to see what process needs to be changed in order to establish the use of DocuSign between the City and MoDOT.

Draft FY 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mitch Skov discussed the TIP projects and budget as follows:

- MoDOT Construction including shoulder improvements New pavement and for Route PP and various other routes, I-70 pavement repair, MO 163 ADA improvements, US 63 pavement and bridge improvements, Route HH bridge improvements and safety ADA Transition projects, Plan improvements, guardrail and guard cable repair and work zone enforcement for various MoDOT construction \$41,362,200/total routes (total costs project costs \$24,263,000/total federal funds \$13,974,500);
- New MoDOT scoping for the Outer Route I-70 Little Cedar Creek improvements, 70 Drainage improvements Interstate and various for excess right of way (total MoDOT scoping costs \$221,000/total project costs \$205,000/total federal funds \$52,700);
- New Columbia street projects including the Forum Green Meadows intersection improvements project, and the Sinclair-Old Mill Creek-Nifong (total Columbia intersection improvement project street project costs \$11,335,000/total new project costs \$3,245,000/total federal funds \$0);
- Columbia sidewalk projects: the Chapel Hill Road Scott Boulevard sidewalk, and the Carter Lane sidewalk (total Columbia sidewalk project costs \$792,095/total new project costs \$506,388/total federal funds \$279,896);
- \$4,185,000 in Get about Columbia carry-over projects from the current FY 2017-2020 TIP;
- New transit projects including CDBG Bus Shelters expenditures and of two lift-equipped vehicles for OATS (total transit project costs \$41,849,732/total \$248,900/total new project costs federal funds \$17,138,357).

Thad Yonke made a motion to approve forwarding the draft FY18 UPWP and TIP to the CATSO Coordinating Committee for review at the August 24, 2017 meeting, with a second by Mike Henderson. The motion passed unanimously.

Mitch Skov discussed potential administrative revisions to proposed roadways Southwest Columbia. Since it is only an administrative revision, no further action is needed.

Tim Teddy commented that the brand name of Columbia's Transit System has GoCOMO. Mike from COMO Connect to Henderson mentioned that MoDOT is in the process of updating its Long-Range Transportation Plan. Mitch Skov stated that the City of Columbia City Council has officially adopted the CATSO MRP that the functional re-classification of а portion of Clark Lane from local nonresidential road to a minor arterial is being processed. He also reminded the committee of the upcoming Transportation Simulation to be held from pm on Wednesday, August 15. Kim Tipton mentioned that TEAP funding is currently available and funding applications are due by September 14.
