Comes Now, complainants whom are members of the Jordan Family, whom reside in the County of Boone, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, file this complaint that defendants,

On or around August2,2005, in front of 212 Lincoln Drive, 1st ward residence Marlon L. Jordan and his 8 year old nephew Keon Stephens, while attempting and or participating in the 'Night Out Against Crime.' We were accosted by a law enforcement officer, Brad Nelson whom obstructed are ingress to join in with our neighbors to peacefully assemble.

It was our intention and purpose to participate in the assemblage for we both came carrying placards and I, wearing my KKK hood, therefore the officer knew or should of known the nature of our presence in front of 212 Lincoln Drive, at around six and six thirty p.m.

Not to mention, that citizens and the news media were already assembled

As the officer approached, he stated to us that we were not wanted and for us to leave. It wasn't until 1st ward councilwoman Almeta Crayton intervned and stated that, " oh yes, he has the right to be here come on you can be here'.

It is the chief of police to protect all citizens and to provide for their securities. Chief Randy Boehm failed in his official capacity and or the performance of his oath to uphold the law equally. He never said a word or made any attempt to stop the attempt and or interference of our right to participate in a federally protected activity.

We the family of Marlon L. Jordan, enjoining in this complaint of our civil rights, declaring the city of Columbia Police Departments acts as intentionally unconstitutional in the promotion of our general welfare as natural persons. The chief and his subordinates have intentionally continued to act with gross reckless indifference and negligence, by arbitrarily obstructing the performance of a governmental operation, pertaining to the deprivations of the equal protections of the U. S. Constitution.

Under the City of Columbia Police Department and the City of Columbia's policies prohibiting police misconduct, based on equal protections of the laws, pertaining to the right to participate in the peaceful assembly, at 212 Lincoln Drive, Keion and I, were interfered and or obstructed by the afore mention defendants.

The conduct by the police departments officers are malicious, and in direct callous disregard and or reckless indifference to complaints right to be free from racially discriminatory patterns and or, practices, without provocation and without due process of law.

As a result of the conduct by the police departments officers, acting under color of law, complainants have suffered and have continued to suffer gross animus misadministration of equal protection from the officers, pertaining to the departmental policies, patterns and or practices, based on race.

Complainants have suffered and will continue to suffer emotional pain, suffering, inconvenience, mental anguish, humiliation, embarrassment, personal degradation, and loss of self esteem, the inability to be efficient and proficient at work and or school.

Wherefore, complaints respectfully request that the above allegations be investigated and prosecuted by the United States Justice Department Civil Rights Division, declaring all acts in violations of complainants Constitutional Rights. Enjoining and permanently restraining defendants from continued violations of civil rights.

Make Complainants whole and compensated for the emotional pain, suffering, inconvenience, mental anguish, humiliation, embarrassment, personal degradation, and loss of self - esteem, the inability to be efficient and proficient at work and or school.

Granting any other appropriate relief necessary and any and all remedies, including legal and equitable relief deemed just and proper by the D. O .J.

Granting an injunction to establish the formation of a Citizens Review Board, with African Americans seated as the majority.

Comes Now, complainants whom are members of the Jordan Family, in relation to the unlawful arrest and detainment of Marlon D. Jordan, on or around June 5,2004 while shopping at the Columbia Mall, was the victim of armed criminal action perpetrated by

Jerrold J. Lee.

Mr. Lee purported to the police that he had been a victim of an alleged robbery, two days prior by Marlon Jordan, with the use of a deadly weapon. Mr. Lee never reported the alleged crimes, as required by law. Mr. Jordan was arrested based on this information from Mr. Lee, by the Columbia Police under the authority and jurisdiction of Chief Randy Boehm AKA... "blinky!"
The laws are clear and for all citizens to enjoy equal access to the pursuit of happiness. We, the family of Marlon D. Jordan, enjoining in these complaints of our civil rights, declaring the city of Columbia Police Departments acts as unconstitutional in the promotion of our general welfare as natural persons.
The chief and his subordinates have acted with gross reckless indifference and

negligence, by arbitrarily obstructing a governmental operation, pertaining to the deprivations of the equal protections of the u.s. Constitution.
It was further substantiated by Commander Marvin Mc Cary, that the police's intent was to remove all criminals off the street, to make the streets safe.

Mr. Jordan was arrested and charges were filed in the Boone County 13th Circuit Court.

Mr. Jordan was intentionally arrested and charged by the department, based on his race. Mr. Jordan was the one of the victims and was not the aggressor and or actor in this incident.

THE conduct by the department was malicious, and in direct callous disregard and or reckless indifference to complainants right to be free from racially discriminatory patterns and or practices, without provocation and without due process of law.

As a result of the conduct by the police departments officers, acting under the color of law, complainants have suffered and will continue to suffer gross animus misadministration of equal protection from the officers, pertaining to the departmental policies, patterns and or practices, based on race.

Complainants have suffered and will continue to suffer emotional pain, suffering, inconvenience, mental anguish, humiliation, embarrassment, personal degradation, and loss of self-esteem, the inability to be efficient and proficient at work and or school.

WHEREFORE, Complainants respectfully requests that the above allegations to be investigated and prosecuted by the United States Justice Department Civil Division, declaring all acts in violations of complainants Constitutional and Civil Rights. Enjoining and permanently restraining defendants from continued violations of civil rights.

Make Complainants whole and compensated for the emotional pain, suffering, inconvenience, mental, anguish, humiliation, embarrassment, personal degradation, and loss of self-esteem, the inability to be efficient and proficient at work and or school.
