AN ORDINANCE

amending Chapter 11 of the City Code relating to Public Health and Human Services Department fees; and fixing the time when this ordinance shall become effective.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 11 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, Missouri, is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 11-17. Charges for health services.

Patrons of the health department shall pay ~~the following fees~~ based on the current Medicaid invoice amount, with the exception of the services listed below, for personal health services. No one will be denied health services for inability to pay.

~~PPD cost plus \$15.00 administrative charge~~

~~Well woman's exam Sliding scaled fee based on income eligibility and Title X/Medicaid guidelines~~

~~STD clinic visit (non-Boone County resident) \$30.00~~

~~STD clinic visit (Boone County resident) \$15.00~~

~~Pregnancy test cost plus \$5.00 administrative charge~~

~~Contraceptive method fees based on sliding scale established for Federal Title X requirements.~~

~~Dental co-pay \$10.00~~

Prescription eye glass co-pay \$10.00

Laboratory testing ~~Cost of lab work plus \$15.00 drawing fee~~

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after October 1, 2013.

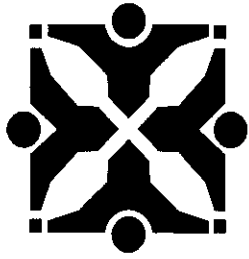

Re: FY2014 Fee Changes Proposed - Health

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

An ordinance amending Chapter 11 of the Code of Ordinances to revise fees for the Public Health and Human Services Department effective October 1, 2013.

DISCUSSION:

Annually, as part of the budget process, staff reviews current fees and recommends adjustments. Currently, fees for health services are delineated in Section 11-17. The department bills Medicaid for these services when the client is Medicaid-eligible. However, Medicaid regulations prohibit us, as a provider, from charging Medicaid more than we are charging any other payee. Some of the fees in the current ordinance are below the current Medicaid reimbursement rate, resulting in loss of potential revenue. Since Medicaid rates can change from time to time, we are proposing the ordinance state that all health services fees match the current Medicaid invoice rate.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Additional fees will generate approximately \$49,740 in revenue.
