AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT dated this _____ day of ________, 2013, is entered into by and between the City of Columbia, Missouri, a municipal corporation (hereinafter "City") and Columbia Public School District (hereinafter "District").

WHEREAS, District is improving the fitness facilities at Hickman High School at the corner of Providence and the Business Loop; and

WHEREAS, City is willing to participate in the funding of the replacement of six (6) tennis courts at Hickman High School; and

WHEREAS, District is willing to make the tennis courts and related facilities available to the public when it is not being used for school activities.

NOW, THEREFORE, City and District agree as follows:

- 1. City will pay District One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) to reimburse District for replacement of six (6) tennis courts at Hickman High School. Payment will be made upon receipt of documentation of actual expenditures made by the District with respect to the facility development.
- 2. As a condition of receiving the payment for these improvements, District agrees:
 - a) The tennis courts shall maintain public access during non-school use and be available for scheduled tennis classes and tournaments either sponsored by City or District.
 - b) District shall be responsible for and shall pay for all maintenance, upkeep and care of the tennis courts at no cost to City. District shall keep the tennis court area in a neat and orderly condition at all times.
 - c) To submit improvement plans and specifications of these tennis courts to City, specifically to the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department, for approval. District shall construct the improvements according to the plan submitted.
 - d) To the fullest extent not prohibited by law, District shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City, its officers, agents and employees from any and all claim of damages, suits, costs, liabilities, actions or proceedings of any nature arising out of the use of the tennis courts, whether by students or by members of the public.
 - e) District shall install and maintain a permanent sign on site that indicates "Partial funding provided by the Park Sales tax." If requested, City's Parks and Recreation Department can provide a sign or the appropriate wording could be incorporated into an existing sign.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, City and District have been duly authorized to execute this Agreement as of the above referenced date.

Re: City/School Agreement for Construction of Tennis Courts at Hickman High School

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Parks & Recreation Department is seeking Council authorization for the City Manager to enter into an agreement with the Columbia Public School District for the construction of a six-court tennis complex at Hickman High School. The P&R Department is contributing \$150,000 towards the \$428,900 total cost of the project. Since this project came after the 2010 Park Sales Tax ballot issue, the department is proposing the use of \$150,000 of the 2010 Park Sales Tax fund balance and has been identified in the City's Fiscal Year 2014 Capital Improvement Program. The project will be managed by the school district and all future maintenance will be their responsibility. The agreement specifies that the courts will be open to the public during non-school use. These will be the only tennis courts available to the public in Ward 1.

DISCUSSION:

Up until 2012, the City and the Columbia Public School District (CPSD) had an agreement where the Hickman Tennis Courts would remain open to the public during non-school use. In 2012, CPSD began numerous renovations to Hickman, which included the demolition of the original four court tennis complex. The Hickman Tennis team began using the Cosmo Park Tennis Courts as their home court while they were waiting on the construction of the new courts. Since 2012, CPSD officials and P&R staff have discussed the possible joint funding of the tennis courts. Because this discussion took place after the 2010 Park Sales Tax ballot, this project is not identified in the list of projects for the 2010 Park Sales Tax ballot issue. After discussions with the City's Finance Department, staff felt comfortable allocating \$150,000 from the balance of the 2010 Park Sales Tax, as the tax revenues to date have exceeded the original forecast.

Staff discussed the option of waiting until the 2015 Park Sales Tax ballot issue, but CPSD felt that proceeding with the construction of the tennis courts as quickly as possible was more advantageous than waiting on additional funding (50% of the project cost) from the department. School District staff has prepared the bid specifications and will act as the project manager for the construction of the courts. Once the project is complete, CPSD will submit a reimbursement request for the \$150,000.

The attached agreement further specifies that the courts will be available to the public when not in use by the school district.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The \$150,000 project is funded by the 2010 Park Sales Tax and is identified in the P&R Department's FY-14 CIP. All future maintenance will be conducted by the Columbia Public School District.
