Re: Summary of Stormwater Calls for Five Years and Ten Years

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Staff has prepared for Council consideration a report concerning the number of stormwater calls received in the last five, and ten years by the Public Works department.

DISCUSSION:

Historically, records pertaining to stormwater related calls were kept sporadically; however, since 2004, each call received by stormwater engineering is logged with a description, inspection, and action taken to address the problem. Descriptions of stormwater problems include: house flooding, yard flooding, street flooding, yard erosion, open channel, severe erosion, failing system and illicit discharge. The last three descriptions, severe erosion, failing system and illicit discharge, were added more recently to the database.

Although yard flooding, street flooding and yard erosion are self explanatory, staff has provided additional explanation for the remaining descriptions below:

House flooding - stormwater entering doors and windows, in a garage or crawl space, water leaking in the basement or coming up a floor drain.

Open channel - concerns about a ditch, creek or drainage way on or near their property.

Severe erosion - areas where the erosion has the potential to significantly impact a structure, the foundation or some other infrastructure, such as a road or utility in the near future.

Failing system - describes an inlet or pipe system that has holes or is collapsing.

Illicit discharge - non-stormwater discharge in a creek or drainage way.

The following table covers a five year period from April 2009 to 2014; and a ten year period from April 2004 to April 2014. A single call could include more than one problem description.

Calls requesting service by stormwater operations, such as unclogging inlets or storm drains, removing sediment and repairing existing inlets and pipes, are not included in the table above, nor are they logged into the engineering maintained database. To date, stormwater operations have responded to 58 requests for service for FY2014.
