Executive Summary

This list of 2015 tracking priorities would supplement the City's existing procedure on intergovernmental relations, adopted last year. The intent is to identify issues and bill subjects as early as possible. As the federal and state legislative sessions proceed, staff will bring specific bills and opportunities to Council's attention for guidance on possible follow-up communication with legislators. The priorities do not identify infrastructure capital projects.

Discussion

The proposed list of City issues is aligned with the City's seven strategic priorities and elements of the Community Vision, where possible. Staff expects the General Assembly to pay particular attention to issues relating to public safety, police conduct and municipal courts. Congress will address issues more national in scope, possibly including bills that would authorize local sales tax on online purchases. At this writing, it is not possible to determine how proposed legislation could affect the City's comprehensive plan.
