Executive Summary

Since 1998, the City has assisted with the funding of outdoor play equipment located within the Columbia Public School District (CPSD). The City's FY-2015 CIP budget includes \$25,000 for the City/School cooperative playground improvement program. CPSD has identified construction of a running/walking track at New Haven Elementary School and new playground equipment at Russell Boulevard Elementary School as their priorities for FY-2015. The City's funding source for the project comes from the 2010 Park Sales Tax, and FY-2015 marks the fourth year of the five-year funding program. An ordinance is needed to authorize the cooperative agreement.

Discussion

Columbia Public School District (CPSD) has identified New Haven Elementary and Russell Boulevard Elementary Schools as their priorities for the \$25,000 FY-2015 City/School playground improvement grant. The specific projects are:

- New Haven Elementary Track \$10,000
- Russell Boulevard Elementary Playground Equipment \$15,000

Previous school projects funded under this policy include Grant (1998); Benton and Field (2000); Lee (2001); West Blvd (2002); (No funding budgeted in FY-2003); Parkade (2004); Mill Creek (2005); Shepard (2006); Blue Ridge, Russell, and Ridgeway (2007); Parkade Phase II (2008); Fairview (2009); Derby Ridge (2010); Grant (2011); West Junior (2012); Shepard, West Blvd., and Lee Elementary (2013); and Hickman High School (2014). These projects have been positively received by both the school and the general public.

The cooperative agreement provides procedures for implementing the playground improvement projects and ensures that the facilities will be open for public use. CPSD is responsible for the construction and ongoing maintenance related to the improvements. This ordinance, if approved, authorizes the cooperative agreement with Columbia Public School District.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT dated this _____ day of ______, 2015, is entered into by and between the City of Columbia, Missouri, a municipal corporation (hereinafter "City") and Columbia Public School District (hereinafter "District").

WHEREAS, District is improving the playground facilities at two elementary schools; specifically, New Haven Elementary School and Russell Boulevard Elementary School; and

WHEREAS, City, in accordance with Policy Resolution 20-98, is willing to participate in funding the construction of a walking/running track at New Haven Elementary School and the acquisition and installation of playground equipment at Russell Elementary School; and

WHEREAS, District is willing to make these playground and running/walking track improvements available to the public when the playground and running/walking track are not being used for school activities.

NOW, THEREFORE, City and District agree as follows:

- 1. City will reimburse District in an amount up to Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) for improvements to the playgrounds at Russell Boulevard Elementary School and New Haven Elementary School. Specific improvements include a new walking/running track at New Haven Elementary School and installation of new playground equipment at Russell Boulevard Elementary School. Reimbursement will be made upon receipt of documentation of actual expenditures made by the District with respect to the facility development.
- 2. As a condition of receiving the payment for these improvements, District agrees to:
 - a. Keep its playground at Russell Elementary School and walking/running track at New Haven Elementary School open to the public at all reasonable times when not in use for school activities.
 - b. Submit improvement plans and specifications to City's Parks and Recreation Department for approval.
 - c. Construct the improvements according to the plan submitted.
 - d. Hold the City harmless for any and all claims or damages for personal injury or property damage arising out of the use of the playground, whether by students or by members of the public.
 - e. Install and maintain a permanent sign on site that indicates: "Partial funding provided by the Park Sales Tax." If requested, Parks & Recreation can

provide a sign or the appropriate wording could be worked into an existing sign.

f. Complete the projects by May 31, 2017. If due to extenuating or unusual circumstances the District is unable to complete the projects by May 31, 2017, the District may request an extension. Requests should be made in writing to the Parks and Recreation Department not less than 30 days prior to the project deadline and should include an explanation of the extenuating circumstances, a report of the progress to date, and the estimated time needed to complete the project(s). Failure to complete the projects on time or obtain approval for a time extension will result in the forfeiture of City funding.
