Executive Summary

Setting a public hearing for May 18th, 2015 concerning the construction of sanitary sewers to serve the properties located within the PCCE #24 - St. James Street and St. Joseph Street Sanitary Sewer Improvement project. The proposed sewer improvement project will serve 14 parcels of land along St. James Street and St. Joseph Street. Each of these parcels are currently served by a private common collector sewer (PCCS). The estimate for this sewer project is \$121,000, and payment shall come from the Sewer Utility Private Common Collector Elimination funds in 2013 Revenue Bond proceeds.

Discussion

On April 14, 2010, two property owners submitted a petition for the formation of a Private Common Collector Elimination project in order to replace the current PCCS. The properties have been experiencing problems with sewer backup into the buildings due to the poor condition of the private sewer and inflow and infiltration into the sewer, and the PCCS does not meet City standards.

In March of 2014, Council directed staff to proceed with the preliminary design and to determine the feasibility and cost of a sewer district for this area. Staff held an Interested Parties (IP) meeting for the project on December 3, 2014, with one property owner in attendance and in support of the sanitary sewer improvements. Staff has attempted to contact all the property owners concerning the proposed preliminary layout.

The preliminary design proposes the construction of approximately 480 linear feet of new sanitary sewer main and the construction of private sewer service laterals necessary to connect the buildings to the new sewer main. The proposed sanitary sewer main would be located through the backyards to serve the properties on St. James Street and St. Joseph Street, and will connect to the city's existing sewer located in the backyards of properties on Ash Street, between St. James and St. Joseph. Easements required for the project will need to be donated by property owners benefitting from the project. It may be necessary to purchase some easements to gain access to the existing public sewer main from the owners of property that will not benefit from the project.

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Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: The total project cost, including construction, is estimated at \$121,000, and will be paid from the Annual Private Common Collector Elimination funds provided in the Sanitary Sewer Utility CIP.

Long-Term Impact: This project will not have a significant impact to annual maintenance and operation costs.


