Re: Administrative Public Improvement Project: Improved Downtown Tree Planter (C49127)

# **Executive Summary**

The Improved Downtown Tree Planter Project is eligible for the administrative public improvement process. Unless Council wishes to follow the standard public improvement Process, staff will proceed with preparing plans and specifications and constructing the project.

#### Discussion

Under Section 22-72(c) of the City Code, the City Manager is required to report to the City Council any public improvement project that the Manager has determined may be performed by the Administrative Public Improvement Process and which meets the eligibility requirements of that process. Unless Council determines that this project should follow the standard public improvement process, the Manager will proceed with the administrative process.

This project will install an improved tree planter at the northeast corner of 10<sup>th</sup> and Broadway, shown on the attached location map. This corner was chosen for the first of what is expected to be the first of many improved tree planters. The existing raised brick planter will be removed and a new bed will be constructed at ground level along with a structural element in the adjacent parking bays which will allow tree roots to extend beneath the parking space pavement. This will allow for increased treatment of storm water runoff. A conceptual diagram is attached. In addition, the project will also include replacement of some failing storm drainage pipes and structures at the same location.

Staff is proposing to utilize an existing term and supply contract, previously bid through the Purchasing Division, to construct this project. If an existing term and supply contractor does not want to participate, then the project will be bid through the Purchasing Division.

The Downtown CID has annual funds earmarked for improving storm water management in the downtown area. In August 2015, the City Council accepted a \$20,000 donation from the Downtown CID to construct an improved tree planter in the downtown area. Since then, staff has communicated extensively with the CID about the project, including the location and general layout of the planter. Both the CID and the adjacent property owner have been kept aware of project progress and will be informed prior to construction. They are supportive of the work in the existing street right-of-way, requiring no additional easements. The CID has expressed interest in constructing this planter soon and adding improved tree planters in other locations. Construction is anticipated for this summer (2016) after all local school commencement activities have occurred.



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# Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: The cost of construction is estimated to be \$30,000 which will be paid from Storm Water Utility funds. \$20,000 of this amount was a donation from the CID. Long-Term Impact: None.


