**I. ADMINISTRATION**

- A. Contractor (Loftis Company) began work of removing the digesters at MLK Battle Garden.
- B. The Cosmo Breakfast Club donated \$5,000 for the Nifong Park animal pen project.
- C. The City of Columbia received the Missouri Arbor Award of Excellence in the Municipalities/Governments Category from the Missouri Department of Conservation and the Missouri Community Forestry Council. The award was presented to Forester Chad Herwald and Natural Resources Supervisor Brett O'Brien at the annual Missouri Community Forestry Council Conference March 3 in Osage Beach, Missouri.
