This container is a letterbox. Letterboxing is an artistic form of hide-and-seek involving exchange of rubber stamp images. Individuals / organizations place containers each with a logbook and a rubber stamp all over the world and share the locations via clues posted on the Internet. Seekers bring with them a personal logbook, their own rubber stamp (usually hand-carved), an inkpad and a pen/pencil, then use the clues to find the box. Once found, seekers use the rubber stamp in the box to stamp their personal logbook then stamp their own stamp into the box's logbook.

Great! You are welcome to join us! We ask only that you follow these few rules:

Letterboxing Rules:

- Please do not move or vandalize the container. The real treasure is just finding the container and sharing your thoughts with everyone else who finds it.

- Feel free to look but do not take anything, especially the rubber stamp. Return ALL contents back to the box. If you brought a pen, write about your visit in the logbook, stamp the logbook (or draw an image if you do not have a rubber stamp), and contact the placer via the website: www.letterboxing.org.

- If you found this container by accident, it is possible someone else may also do so, which increases the chances that it may be vandalized. Therefore, please be discrete when re-hiding AND re-hide well in the same location that you found it (preferably so that no part of the container is visible).

Intentionally or not!**

This container is a geocache (pronounced geo-cash). Geocaching is a high-tech treasure hunting game for GPS (Global Positioning Systems) users. Individuals / organizations place containers such as this one all over the world and share the latitude and longitude coordinates of these caches on the Internet. GPS users then use the coordinates to search an area to find the caches.

Great! You are welcome to join us! We ask only that you follow these few rules:

Geocaching Rules:

- Please do not move or vandalize the container. The real treasure is just finding the container and sharing your thoughts with everyone else who finds it.

- Most geocaches have trinkets. If you take a trinket from the cache, you must leave something of equal or greater value for the cache, and you must write about your visit in the logbook and on the website: www.geocaching.com.

- If you found this container by accident, it is possible someone else may also do so, which increases the chances that it may be vandalized. Therefore, please be discrete when re-hiding AND re-hide well in the same location that you found it (preferably so that no part of the container is visible).
