Interested Parties Meeting

PURPOSE OF TODAY'S MEETING

Thank You for taking time to attend this meeting. This is an informal open house style meeting to inform local residents and other interested persons about the proposed trail project. This meeting is an opportunity for citizens to ask questions and offer input regarding the proposed project, prior to a formal Public Hearing which will be held by the City Council at a later date.

PROJECT INFORMATION

- This project has been listed in the City's Capital Improvement Program since FY 2011. City Council approved moving this project forward to the design phase at the City Council meeting on September 3, 2013.
- County House Trail Phase 1 connects the Twin Lakes Recreation Area to Stadium Boulevard. This project will extend the trail north to Rollins Road.
- Project length is approximately 3,400 feet. Construction is expected to begin in FY2016.
- Concept cost estimate for this project is \$445,000. The funding source is GetAbout Columbia, a federal grant awarded to our community in 2006 for a non-motorized transportation pilot program.
- Concept design includes a 10' wide trail beginning at the north terminus of County House Trail Phase 1. There will be a crosswalk across College Park Drive before routing around the Southwest Swim Club. The trail will then extend north from the end of Oxford Drive, along the County House Branch creek, to Rollins Road.
- Most of the project will be located on existing City easement. Some additional permanent and temporary construction easements will be necessary for construction of the project.
- The project is being coordinated with a traffic calming project on College Park Drive. The City's Traffic Department has listed College Park Drive as number 2 out of 40 streets prioritized for traffic calming measures.
- The project is being coordinated with a Capital Improvement Program stormwater project on Rollins Road. The City's Stormwater Department has a future project (3-5 years) to replace the failing corrugated metal pipe underneath Rollins Road with a box culvert.
