

Notice of Intent to Request Release of Funds

*City of Columbia, 500 E. Walnut, Suite 108, P.O. Box 6015,
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On or after June 27, 2016, the City of Columbia will submit a request to the Department of Housing and Urban Development for the release of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended; and for HOME Investment Partnership funds under Title II of the National Affordable Housing Act, as amended, to undertake the following projects, including anticipated funds from other funding sources:

- Lynn Cottages Community Solar for homes located at 109, 111, and 113 Lynn Street, \$40,000.
- NRT Demolition and Acquisition Program, NRT Area, \$85,000.
- Bus Shelter Construction, Broadway & Garth, Worley and Garth, Vandiver Government Center, and MU Health Clinic, \$100,000.
- Centro Latino Exterior Renovations, 609 N. Garth, \$25,000.
- Boone County Family Resources Facility Demolition, 4632 Appletree Lane, \$25,000.
- Oak Tower Rehabilitation, 700 N. Garth, \$80,000.

The City has determined that the Environmental Assessments and Environmental Reviews have findings of no significant impact (FONSI) under HUD regulations 24 CFR Part 58 from the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) requirements. An Environmental Review Record (ERR) that documents the environmental determinations for both projects is on file at the City of Columbia Housing and CDBG Programs Office, 500 E. Walnut, Suite 108, P.O. Box 6015, Columbia, MO 65205 where the ERR's can be examined or copied weekdays 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.

Public Comments

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERRs to the City of Columbia Department of Community Development. All comments received by 5:00 P.M. June 27, 2016 will be considered by the City of Columbia prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds.

Release of Funds

The City of Columbia certifies to the Department of Housing and Urban Development that Mike Matthes, in his capacity as City Manager, consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the City of Columbia to use HUD program funds.

Objections to Release of Funds

HUD will accept objections to its release of funds and the City of Columbia's certification for a period of 15 days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Columbia; (b) the City of Columbia has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to HUD at the Department of Housing and Urban Development, Robert A. Young Federal Building, 1222 Spruce Street, Third Floor, St. Louis, Missouri 63103. Potential objectors should contact HUD to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
