


Immediate Action Items

Housing		
Hold landlords responsible for housing quality	Office of Neighborhood Services addresses Property Maintenance Code violations, including peeling paint, broken windows, and other maintenance concerns.	If you have a specific property of concern, please let us know by calling 573-817-5050. We'll have one of our inspectors check it out and follow up with you.
Community Character/Green space/Beautification

Want community gardens	Community gardens are an eligible use on any vacant residential or commercial property. These uses are traditionally organized by neighborhood groups with the consent of the property owner.	The Community Garden Coalition (CGC) lists local gardens and available plots in several locations, including one at the Columbia/Boone County Health Dept. (1005 W. Worley. See http://comogardens.org/gardens/ for more information.
Want paved driveways	City Code requires all new driveways to be dust-free surface (i.e., asphalt or concrete); current gravel driveways can be maintained but not expanded.	If you have a specific property of concern, please let us know by calling 573-817-5050. We'll have one of our inspectors check it out and follow up with you.
Land use/zoning/redevelopment		
Want to rezone land on the NE corner of Worley & Clinkscales to office and/or commercial	Applications for rezoning may be submitted by the property owner to the Community Development Department, and are decided by Council after being reviewed for consistency with the City's comprehensive plan and future land use map and policy guidelines, including any applicable neighborhood or sub-area plans.	No application has been filed. The existing future land use map does not consider small office uses to be inappropriate at this location (see Neighborhood District guidelines).
Want local coffee shops, bars, restaurants	Recruit desirable tenants to existing commercial locations	Locations zoned for commercial uses are generally only on the periphery of the neighborhood, but locations where these uses are allowed exist presently.
Transportation/Streets/Sidewalks/Safety		
Speeding and cut-through commercial traffic. (Speeding is an issue on numerous streets, including Spencer, Anderson, Again, Oak, Clinton, Donnely, Hardin, Greenwood, Ash, & West Blvd. Other related concerns include traffic noise on West Blvd N., and commercial traffic generated by automobile dealerships on I-70 Drive.)	City Public Works' Traffic Engineers have numerous resources and programs for traffic-related concerns, including "Kid Friendly" speed signs, Speed Watch and Traffic Management programs (573-874-7250). In addition to these programs, the Police Dept. has a radar trailer that they can park on your street for a few days to alert motorists of their speed. It may be possible to have the patrol officer issue speeding tickets as well. Potholes on side streets	Call Public Works at 573.874.6289 go search for "report potholes" on www.gocolumbiamo.com to report the location of a pothole.	Let Public Works know whenever you see a pothole and they will add it to the list to be fixed. Please forward more significant issues you see to Public Works as well.
More & better bus shelters	ToDo: Direct neighbors to voting site for future CDBG funded bus shelters in 2016.	Location at Worley and Clinkscales (West Middle School) up for public vote. WANA sent CDBG bus shelter survey to listserv. Also went out to all NAs.

Lighting glare at Health Dept parking lot	Spoke to Thad Yonke at County to enquire. Also mentioned this should be considered as building is evaluated for energy efficiency for Georgetown Energy Challenge.	Make a plan request.
