neighborhood
planning?

Planning provides an opportunity for you and your neighbors to establish a common vision of what you want your neighborhood to be. The neighborhood planning process is designed to help you identify issues and opportunities, and establish goals and recommendations for improving the neighborhood. Adopted plans will be used by city officials to guide growth and development, as well as providing neighbors with tools for better communication, engagement and advocacy.

How can a plan help
my neighborhood?

Adopted plans will...

- Identify neighborhood goals and priorities
- Guide future land use decisions
- Give direction to the City regarding neighborhood programs, services, and capital improvements
- Inform potential developers of neighborhood needs and desires

What issues will
plans address?

Plans may address the following issues:

- Incompatible land uses and/or zoning
- Affordable and diverse housing options
- Commercial service needs
- Design guidelines for mixed-use development
- Preservation of historic structures or neighborhood character
- Accessibility and traffic-related issues
- Public infrastructure service and maintenance
- Enhancements to streetscapes, parks, and other community amenities
