Cosmo Bethel Shelter and Restroom Replacement

<u>Summary:</u> The Department of Parks and Recreation is requesting authorization to proceed with the replacement of the 30+ year old picnic shelter and restroom buildings at Cosmo-Bethel Park. Total project cost is \$255,000 with funding coming from the Park Sales Tax. Construction is scheduled to begin this winter with an estimated opening date of spring 2008. Project will be completed using contract labor with final landscaping done by force account labor. The restroom and shelter will be similar to those as constructed at Stephens Lake Park.

<u>Project Description:</u> The Department of Parks and Recreation is requesting authorization to proceed with the replacement of the shelter and restroom at Cosmo-Bethel Park. As identified in the *Parks, Recreation, and Open Space Master Plan*, these 30+ year old facilities have been repaired and modified throughout the years, but are now at a point where replacement is required.

Funding for the project was included in the City's FY-08 capital improvement budget with a total estimated project cost of \$255,000 with funding coming from the Park Sales Tax. Construction is scheduled to begin this winter with an estimated opening date of spring 2008. It is anticipated that the shelters and restroom will be demolished and the new facilities constructed at or very near the former site to take advantage of the existing utilities. The demolition and construction of the restroom building will be contracted while Park Department staff will handle the final landscaping. The new shelter and restroom will be similar to those as constructed at Stephens Lake Park and it is anticipated that the restroom will be heated for year round use or at least an extended season use.

Public information on this projected was made by contacting user groups such as the Columbia Public School District and local athletic organizations; posting the information on the department's web site and on October 18, 2007, conducted an interested parties meeting at the ARC. All comments were in favor of the project. The project will be bid through the City's Purchasing Department and will be bid with a similar restroom project at Cosmo Park.

Recommended Council Action: If the Council concurs that the project should proceed, the resolution calling for the public hearing should be approved. Following the public hearing, the ordinance authorizing the construction phase of the project should be adopted.
