RE: Permanent Park Improvement Fund Transfers

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Columbia Parks and Recreation Department has received several donations to help support two recreation programs. These donations include: various checks totaling \$1,750 for the Toys for Columbia's Youth Program and a check from Perlow-Stevens Gallery in the amount of \$685 for the CARE Gallery. This Ordinance accepts the donations and appropriates the funds to the proper account for expenditure during FY 09.

DISCUSSION:

The Parks and Recreation Department has received several donations in support of certain recreation programs it offers.

Various donations totaling \$1,750 from individuals and local organizations have been received to help with the expenses to purchase toys for the Toys for Columbia's Youth Program. Toys were purchased for low-income children ages 1 to 14 years. The checks have been deposited into the Permanent Park Improvement Fund. This ordinance authorizes the appropriation of these funds to the Community Recreation programs expenditure account.

The C.A.R.E. Gallery is the arts component of the CARE program. Perlow-Stevens Gallery donated \$685 for reimbursement of supplies and materials for the CARE Gallery exhibit. This amount was deposited into the Permanent Park Improvement Fund. This ordinance would allow for those funds to be placed in the CARE Gallery expenditure account.
