Re: Street Closure Requests

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

The City Manager's Office has received street closure requests for the following events: Harpo's SEC Hospitality (September 3rd Council meeting REP136-13), Bengals SEC Hospitality, SoCo SEC Hospitality, Campus Bar SEC Hospitality, Shiloh Bar SEC Hospitality, The Heidelberg SEC Hospitality, Room 38 SEC Hospitality, Casablanca SEC Hospitality, MU Pagan Pride, Electric Flurry Concert and the Susan G. Komen Race.

**DISCUSSION:**

1. UltraMax Sports has requested the closure of Elm St. between 5th and 9th, 6th Street between Peace Park and Locust and 7th Street between Elm and Locust on Saturday, October 12th from the hours of 3 a.m. until 1 p.m. for the annual Susan G. Komen Run/Walk.

2. Mid-Missouri Pagan Pride has requested the closure of Elm St. between 6th and 8th to hold an educational festival on Saturday, September 22, from the hours of 8 a.m. thru 8 p.m.

The Special Events Committee doesn't have any concerns with the The Pagan Pride and Susan G. Komen events. Both applications have been forwarded to the CID for review at the September 10th meeting.

3. At the September 3 Council meeting, Council reviewed a request from Kevin Fitzpatrick to close Cherry Street, from 9th to 10th Streets, for all home football games. In reviewing the tape of the Council meeting, staff discovered there was no formal Council action taken. Therefore, staff is bringing their request back for formal Council motion and vote.

4. Room 38 has requested the closure of Walnut St. between 8th St. west to the alley on Saturday, October 26th from noon until midnight to hold a Homecoming Hospitality Zone for SEC fans. They are also requesting a waiver of the open container ordinance from noon until Midnight.

5. Casablanca has requested the closure of Elm St. between 5th and 6th on Saturday, October 26th from 10 a.m. until 2 a.m. to hold a Homecoming Hospitality Zone for SEC fans. They are also requesting a waiver of the open container ordinance from noon until midnight.

6. The SoCo Club has requested the closure of 7th St. from Locust St. north to the alley on Saturday, October 26th from noon until midnight to hold a Homecoming Hospitality Zone for SEC fans. They are also requesting a waiver of the open container ordinance from noon until midnight.

7. Bengal's has requested the closure of 6th St. between Elm and Walnut on Saturday, October 26th from noon until midnight to hold a Homecoming Hospitality Zone for SEC fans. They are also requesting a waiver of the open container ordinance from noon until midnight.

8. Shiloh Bar and Grill has requested the closure of 4th St. between Broadway south to the alley on Saturday, October 26th from 10 a.m. until 2 a.m. to hold a Homecoming Hospitality Zone for SEC fans. They are also requesting a waiver of the open container ordinance between the hours of noon until midnight.

9. Campus Bar and Grill has requested the closure of 9th St. between Elm south to Chipotle entrance on Saturday, October 26th from the hours of 10 a.m. until 2 a.m. to hold a Homecoming Hospitality Zone for SEC fans. They are also requesting a waiver of the open container ordinance between the hours of Noon until Midnight.

10. The Heidelberg has requested the closure of 9th Street from University Ave. north to the alley on Saturday, October 26th from the hours of 10 a.m. until 2 a.m. to hold a Homecoming Hospitality Zone for SEC fans. They are also requesting a waiver of the open container ordinance from noon until midnight.

11. Electric Flurry, LLC has requested the closure of 6th street and Elm Street surrounding Casablanca, Bengal's and Mizzou Lot and Elm St. Between 6th and 7th and 6th between Elm and Chesnut St. on Friday, October 4th from 6 a.m. until 5 a.m. the following Saturday, October 5th. They are also requesting a waiver of the open container ordinance between the hours of 5 p.m. Friday until 1 a.m. Saturday, October 5th.

The multiple Homecoming events have not been reviewed at a Special Events Committee meeting, the next meeting will be held on September 18th. Applications were forwarded via email and comments and concerns were received. The CID will review applications at their September 10th meeting.

The Electric Flurry Concert event has not been reviewed by the Special Events Meeting, the next meeting will be held on September 18th. The application was forwarded to Committee via email for comment. See attached sheet for comments. The CID will review request at their September 10th meeting.

**\*\*Comments Received From Special Event Committee Members re: Homecoming Events and Electric Flurry Concert:**

Risk Management – Sarah Perry:

It is my recommendation the request for the SEC associated closures be handled the same, and with the same requirements, as were discussed for Harpos. This needs to include general and liquor liability coverage in the amounts of \$2,000,000 per occurrence with a minimum of \$2,000,000 aggregate, with the City as an additional insured and proof of workers' compensation insurance which meet Missouri Statutory requirements. A certificate of insurance has been provided by Harpos and the same would be necessary for the events where they plan to close City streets for concerts and/or service of liquor.

Business License Office – Janice Finley:

It should be noted that many of the affected property owners/tenants opposed the street closures and indicated such on the forms.

University of Missouri – John Murray; letter is attached:

Carol should have a letter from me expressing that we would need to charge for services for anything adjacent to campus, for MUPD, clean-up, and any damages. This is consistent with what has been done for 4th of July and Roots and Blues when it was in that location. Generally speaking, we are not in favor of these closures on Homecoming for several reasons; Law enforcement is stretched thin due to football and other Homecoming activities and we are concerned about the safety and security around these activities. We are also concerned about the disruption of traffic, pre and post game. We are also concerned about disruption of traditional homecoming activities.

Regarding Electric Flurry, we just received that one Friday afternoon and I'm in the process of reviewing and circulating it for comment. At first glance, I would say that it would be very disruptive to campus operations on Friday to close those streets that early. Not to mention, the same charges would need to apply and a mechanism for that would need to be in place. Additionally, our Environmental Health and Safety folks would be very interested in more information about the foam that is being proposed. What is it made up of, and how will it be cleaned up? What is the environmental impact of it? I will forward the form to you when we have comments. Thank you. Let me know if you have any questions.

Columbia Police Department – Krista Shouse-Jones:

Although we want every establishment to be successful in the downtown district, CPD is concerned with the idea of multiple street closures downtown (especially at the same time) due to the following issues:

1. Home Football weekends - closing alternative routes when major traffic arteries are congested creates concerns and potential gridlock downtown. These closures also limit the ability for emergency responders (not just police, but also fire and medics) to safely and quickly respond to emergencies in an already relatively confined, congested, heavily-populated area during days/times when these factors are multiplied. With the increased vehicle and pedestrian traffic in the downtown area on these days, the likelihood of such emergencies is already increased.

2. Closing off the ingress/egress from private owned alleys.

3. These seem to be block party type events without many details explaining specifically what types of activities and numbers of attendees are expected in each venue. This lack of information inhibits all City departments' ability to adequately respond or prepare for mobilizing the resources that would be needed to accommodate these events. None of the submitted requests outline any specific plan for security for these events.

4. The Police Department already restricts essential employees from being able to take off on MU home football game days so we can maximize use of our personnel. Some of these officers are used to fill short-notice needs for traffic control and other game day-related functions. In addition, we require off-duty officers to work overtime on these days to assist with inbound and outbound traffic control for the games, additional foot patrols downtown, and team escorts.

5. The Downtown CPD Unit currently consists of four officers and a sergeant. Even with the additional foot patrol officers on game days, with multiple crowd-attracting venues where alcohol is being served, there would likely not be enough officers available (either on-duty or on overtime) to cover all of the need for police services.

Per a discussion with the rest of CPD Command Staff this morning, the manner and number in which these requests have been made underscore the need for a more defined process and ordinances that cover special events planning. CPD would support such an effort. We cannot, however, support the approval of multiple street closures in the downtown area.

Columbia Fire Department -- Terry Cassil:

CFD is also concerned with the number of events at one time and our ability to access streets to make emergency calls.

City Manager's Office -- Carol Rhodes:

Dependent upon the time of the Homecoming Parade on October 26th, the street closure requests for The Heidelberg, Campus Bar & Grill, Bengal's and Casablanca, directly affect the approved route for the parade. In addition, the multiple closures will have a significant impact on traffic flow post parade.

Per Sec. 24-73. Downtown Street use permits.

Item (d): The city council shall not close a street and issue a street use permit unless it determines that:

- (1) No safety hazard will be created, and
- (2) No obstruction will be created that would unreasonably interfere with police, fire or health protection of the city, and

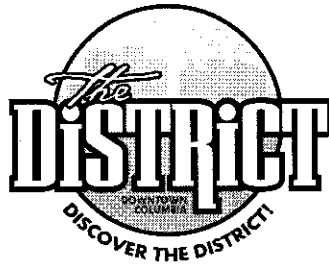

Mr. Mayor and City Council:

The board recognizes that the closing of streets on a football weekend is a divisive issue and that some parties will be unhappy regardless of the decision.

We understand that the city's 750 ft. rule will prohibit a patchwork of street closures that will serve to snarl traffic and confuse visitors. Since we do not know the exact time each application was submitted and many of the applications were incomplete, we treated all equally and trust that the city will address each complete application in the order it was received.

We also realize that the 750 ft. rule does not apply if applicants voluntarily waive the rule and team up to host joint events in which everyone benefits. However, since there is little expectation of that happening, we leave it to the city to sort out which application takes precedence.

Finally, we would like to point out that 36 hours is simply not enough time for the CID Board to review and vote on these applications, particularly since the vast majority of them were incomplete. I can't imagine that the city's Special Events Committee (SEC) finds this time frame any more manageable than we do. In light of that, we urge the City Council to adopt the new application standards created by the SEC with input from the CID in which we recommend 60 days for review by both bodies.

As far as specific applications are concerned, we reviewed them in the standard manner and have the following general comments:

- 1) Applications were not complete.
- 2) Some did not have signatures of abutting businesses.
- 3) Some had signatures based on an application for four or more closures even though an amended application for only one day had been attached. (It is possible that a one-day closure is more amenable to a business than a four-day one).
- 4) Some failed to note the event time, listing only the time the street was closed.
- 5) All appear to violate the noise ordinance, which requires music to end at 11 pm.

- 6) Many were lacking detailed layout plans for the street, including elements such as emergency vehicle routes and entrances and exits.
- 7) Logistical plans that outline trash removal, security, public safety, electrical needs, maximum occupancy, restroom facilities, etc. are missing.

While these are primarily issues that are handled by the Special Events Committee, it is difficult to see how these issues will be addressed by the SEC prior to these applications going before Council. In addition, it is often our policy to offer suggestions to the applicant—such as a change in the closure area or a change of time—that may make the event more acceptable to surrounding neighbors and then request another review at our next meeting. Given the tight timeframe, we are unable to use this approach to find a working compromise between businesses and the applicants.

That said, our recommendations are as follows:

**Bengal's Hospitality Zone, Oct 26<sup>th</sup>, 12pm-12am**

Approved amended request pending MU approval and adherence to the noise ordinance.

**Casablanca Hospitality Zone, Oct 26<sup>th</sup>, 10am-2am**

Approved pending MU approval and adherence to noise ordinance.

**SoCo's Hospitality Zone, Oct 26<sup>th</sup>**

Approved pending approval by Chong's and adherence to noise ordinance. We recommend either altering the times of the street closure to better mesh with the hours Chong's is open or altering the closure so that their driveway is not blocked.

**Shiloh Bar and Grill Hospitality Zone, Oct 26<sup>th</sup>, 10am-2am**

Approved pending approval from T's Etc and the Ice House and adherence to noise ordinance. We recommend either altering the times of the street closure to better mesh with the hours of Ts Etc and any other businesses still remaining in the Ice House or altering the closure so that customers still have access to their doors.

**Room 38's Hospitality Zone, Oct 26<sup>th</sup>, 12pm-12am**

Approved pending either approval by Bleu or changes to the street closure plan. One option may be to shift the closure to Eighth and receive approval from any affected businesses. This would also depend on preserving some sort of access to the garage. Approval is also pending adherence to noise ordinance.

**Campus Bar & Grill's Hospitality Zone, Oct 26<sup>th</sup>, 9am-12am**

Approved pending approval from surrounding businesses (including MU) or altering the closure so it's only in front of Campus Bar or on the Elm St. side of Campus Bar. Approval is also pending adherence to noise ordinance.

**Electric Flurry Concert, Oct 4<sup>th</sup> 6am- Oct 5<sup>th</sup> 5am**

Approved pending approval from MU and Casablanca and adherence to noise ordinance. Also, the 5 am end time is unclear—it should go without saying that this is an unacceptable end time to an event. Clarification is necessary to determine when the event actually ends and how long clean up will take. It should also be noted that Bengals has informed us that they are not involved with this event and that the organizers are located in New York. Given that, it is imperative that an on-site organizer be available to meet with the SEC multiple times in order to gain a clear understanding of the city's expectations for an event such as this.


**The Heidelberg Hospitality Zone, Oct 26<sup>th</sup>, 10am-2am**

The Heidelberg submitted an application but they are not located in the CID, therefore there was no vote.

As you can see, there are many reasons why both the CID and the SEC require more time to work through the details of any proposed events.


Carol,

The University was presented with the Street Use Request by Bengals on August 21, 2013. We reviewed the request and determined that we were not in favor of the closure of 6<sup>th</sup> and Elm Streets on SEC football weekends. We returned the form without our approval on August 22. On August 23, we received the request to amend the form and resubmit for our consideration the closure of 6<sup>th</sup> Street only (north of Elm).

That amended form has not been returned, but is progressing through our normal process. At this point, we feel it is important to point out that any such activity on streets adjacent to campus has staffing, and other, costs associated with it. As has been our standard procedure with the Roots and Blues festival in its previous location and for Fire in the Sky in its current location, the organizers are charged for the cost of MUPD officers at \$45.00/hour. Additionally, these organizers are charged for any damages to our property from the result of the activities.

Our expectation would be that the hosts of any such activities approved on streets adjacent to campus would be accountable to pay these same expenses. Please let me know if you have any questions.

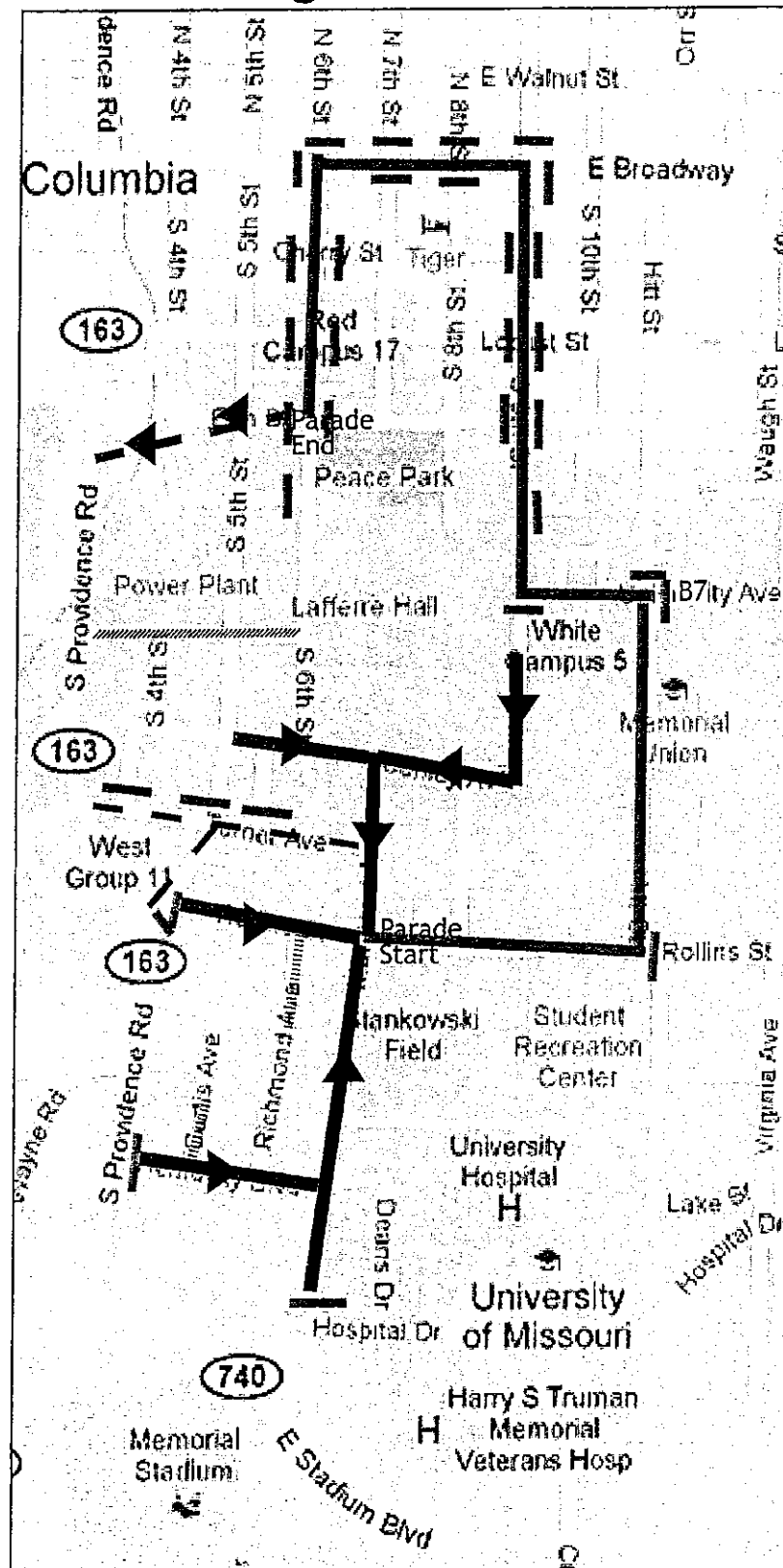

## PART II - CODE OF ORDINANCES

### Chapter 24 STREETS, SIDEWALKS AND PUBLIC PLACES

#### **Sec. 24-71. Required; application; conditions for issuance.**

- (a) Whenever any person shall desire to temporarily block a portion of any public street or sidewalk outside of the downtown area as described in section 24-73 for any purpose other than the collection of signatures on a petition or the dissemination of information, or work under a permit issued by the director of public works under article II, division 2 for a closing not exceeding thirty (30) days, such person shall make application on a form to be supplied by the city to the city manager not less than ten (10) days prior to the next city council meeting preceding the date the person shall desire to use such street or sidewalk. The city manager may issue a permit to such person to use a portion of such street or sidewalk to such extent and for such time as the city manager shall find to be reasonably necessary, provided that the city manager shall find that the following conditions exist:
- (1) No safety hazard will be created as determined by the director of public works or his designate, and
  - (2) No obstruction will be created that would unreasonably interfere with police, fire or health protection of the city, and
  - (3) No unreasonable interference with the normal uses of the abutting property will be created.
- (b) The person making an application to the city manager shall, as a part of the application, present evidence that all users or owners or occupants of property abutting the area to be used have been notified of the use, the dates and time of such use and their right to protest under this section.
- (Code 1964, § 14.010(B); Ord. No. 9995, § 1, 11-7-83; Ord. No. 10140, § 1, 4-2-84; Ord. No. 20654, § 6-21-10; Ord. No. 21051, § 1, 8-15-11)

#### **Sec. 24-72. Appeals; hearings before council.**

- (a) Any person aggrieved by a denial of a permit by the city manager may file an appeal within five (5) days following such denial with the city council to be acted upon at the next regular council meeting after said appeal is filed. The city council shall use the standards set out in section 24-71 in making its determination whether to uphold or reverse the city manager's denial of the permit.
- (b) Any user, occupant or owner of property within the same general area of, or abutting the portion of the street or sidewalk to be used may either file a written protest or appeal before the city council to register such a protest, and the city council shall also consider such protest in making its determination whether to uphold or reverse the city manager.
- (Code 1964, § 14.010(c); Ord. No. 9995, § 1, 11-7-83; Ord. No. 21051, § 1, 8-15-11)

#### **Sec. 24-73. Downtown street use permits.**

- (a) City council authorization is required to close any street in the downtown area. For purposes of this article, "downtown area" means the area bound on the north by Park Avenue, on the east by College Avenue, on the south by Elm Street and on the west by Providence Road.
- (b) Any person wishing to have the city council close a street in the downtown area for a special event may file a written application for a street closure and street use permit with the city manager on a form supplied by the city manager's office. The application must be filed at least ten (10) days before the regularly scheduled city council meeting at which the request will be considered.
- (c) As part of the application, the applicant shall present evidence that all owners or occupants of property abutting the street to be closed have been notified of the proposed street closure and their right to address the city council in opposition to the street closure.
- (d) The city council shall not close a street and issue a street use permit unless it determines that:

### Chapter 24 STREETS, SIDEWALKS AND PUBLIC PLACES

- (1) No safety hazard will be created, and
- (2) No obstruction will be created that would unreasonably interfere with police, fire or health protection of the city, and
- (3) No unreasonable interference with the normal uses of the abutting property will be created.
- (e) The city council normally shall not close a street and issue a street use permit when the street requested to be closed is within seven hundred fifty (750) feet of a street that the council has previously closed for the same time, unless the holder of the earlier street use permit has been notified and consents to the subsequent street closure.
- (f) The holder of a street use permit must obtain all other required city licenses and permits. The special event committee appointed by the city manager will advise the permit holder of additional licenses and permits that are required based upon information provided by the permit holder.
- (g) No vendors may operate within the closed street without the permission of the street use permit holder. This subsection shall not prevent the owners of businesses adjacent to the closed street from selling items on the sidewalk as otherwise permitted by law.
- (h) No peddler shall conduct peddling within seven hundred fifty (750) feet of a street closed under this section without the written permission of the city manager. The manager shall not give such written permission without first consulting with the street use permit holder to determine whether such peddling will interfere with the special event to be held on the closed street.
- (i) Access to businesses that abut the street closure shall be maintained during the normal business hours of the affected business.
- (j) No street use permit holder or other person shall block off a street in a manner that prevents the free movement of pedestrians into and out of the closed street area.
- (k) No entry fee shall be charged to a person who resides or operates a business in the closed street area or to a customer of or person making delivery to a business or residence in the closed street area.

Event: ELECTRIC FLURRY: MIZZOU (live music festival/concert)

Date: Friday, Oct. 4th

Location: 6th & Elm Streets surrounding Casablanca, Bengals Bar & Grill, and Mizzou Lot. One stage in southeast corner of intersection along Peace Park facing northwest. Elm from 6th to 7th, as well as 6th from Elm to Chestnut also blocked for traffic flow purposes. Our current plan allows for Mizzou parking lots north and east of Bengals to remain open for normal use until 5pm (enter north lot via 5th Street; enter east/Heinkel lot via Locust and 7th Street) so that University staff/faculty/students can arrive and depart campus with little hassle. All speakers will be directed away from campus and sound checks will be kept to a minimum to minimize the noise from event on campus.

Artists: Rock, Electronic, and Alternative groups.

Time: Event (aka open container) runs 5pm-1am (set up from 6am-5pm; clean up from 1am-3am)

Crowd Estimates: Simon Associates calculated our Occupancy Load/Capacity. IBC Table 1004.1.1 requires 5 net square feet per person. Simon Associates calculated over 34,000 square feet of outdoor space, which would allow 8.5 square feet for 4,000 people (well above the minimum requirement). This calculation didn't include the north half block on 6th Street (from Lancaster to Locust) which we are now using, so there is even more room for at least 5,000+.

Safety/Security: Six professional private security guards will stand around front of stage (between stage and crowd) to ensure safety and watch for problems. Twenty five security personnel will monitor all entrances/exits, perimeter, back alley areas, and roam crowd to ensure an incident-free event. The Downtown Police will also be on hand (or nearby). 6 foot chain link fencing and orange nylon fencing will contain event. Barricades will block rear access behind Bengals (w/ paid security personnel monitoring area). We will work with the University to accommodate their police force needs.

ADA: We have worked hard to create an accessible event for all guests to enjoy. The entire venue is ADA accessible. Bengals Bar & Grill is ADA compliant (with two ADA compliant restroom facilities), with two additional ADA portapotties. In addition to the 6 stalls inside Bengals, we have 30 regular portapotties. Special ADA parking is set aside in the Mizzou Heinkel Building Lot on a first come first served basis. Event staff will be on hand to assist patrons as they arrive. Pets are not allowed in the venue. However, service animals, which have been trained to provide assistance to an individual with a disability, are welcome. The owner of the animal may be asked to describe the type of service the animal provides.

Alcohol Sales on Streets: Four small beer stands

Trash/Recycling/Clean-up: Twenty Five 55-gallon commercial trash bins and 10 recycling stations will be placed throughout venue, including at all entrances and exits. Event staff will require all exiting guests to dispose of any food or drinks. Event staff will regularly empty and replace bins as needed. City will be notified of any extra dumpster emptying as needed. Following event, event staff will sweep venue for debris and recycle as needed. Event staff will walk surrounding streets and Peace Park to pick up any debris that may have been created by event patrons. City streets and University property will be left in the condition we started with.

#### Emergency Plan:

. Situation: Community wide live music festival on 6th & Elm Streets involving 1,000 to 5,000 fans, entertainers, and event staff

. Notification: The command center will monitor weather and be aware of notifications and warnings. Outdoor warning sirens may be activated, NOAA weather monitors may be activated, and lighting monitors may be activated.

. Procedure: Notification to the public should be made well in advance of severe weather—a minimum of 30 minutes. Persons should be directed to leave the outdoor venue, if time allows, in a direction with non-storm involvement. Do not try to outrun the storm. Should persons be required to stay in the area they should seek shelter in a stable structure, lower level (below grade), without windows or expansive ceilings. In the event of such an emergency, fans can seek shelter in numerous surrounding buildings, including Bengals Bar & Grill, Casablanca Restaurant, The Islamic Center of Mid-Missouri, Flat Branch Pub & Brewery, etc.

. If in open lay in a flat area that will not flood

. If you are on the road in your vehicle, exit and lay in a non-flooding ditch

. If tornado strength winds are expected do not seek shelter in your vehicle

. If no building interior shelter is available, parking structures may be used but not preferred (this alternative is better than being in the open):

. Beware of potential debris

. Beware of potential car movement

. Crouch low near a sidewall or behind support piers

. An enclosed stairwell without glass
