EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Staff has prepared for Council consideration legislation setting a public hearing for May 19, 2014 for the purpose of determining special benefits and levying special assessments against lots and parcels of land within the recently completed Sanitary Sewer District No. 165 (Maple Bluff Drive). The total cost of the project was \$528,941.10, and funding for the project is proposed from tax bills levied against the properties within the sewer district and from sanitary sewer utility funds.

DISCUSSION:

Prior to the project, the thirteen (13) properties within Sewer District 165 were served by on-site wastewater treatment septic systems, most of which were failing and had been cited by the Health Department. Construction of the project consisted of 3,634 linear feet of 8-inch diameter gravity sewer main, and included new private service connections and installation of 1,440 linear feet of 4-inch sewer service lateral, required to reconnect the existing structures to the new sewer main.

The estimated tax bill amounts to the individual properties ranged from \$25,515.73 to \$175,889.34, if the entire estimated project costs were to be tax billed. If the \$5,000 initial tax bill cap, as provided in Chapter 22-97.1 of the City Code of Ordinances, would be utilized for all of the parcels, approximately \$463,941 would be in deferred tax bills. Staff recommended against assessing this amount, and deferring those tax bills as it is unlikely they would ever be collected due to the size of the lots; all lots are approximately one acre in size with the exception of one lot being over six acres. The reason for the recommendation was that bond funds were going to be used for this project, and federal arbitrage rules do not allow expenditures that are to be repaid, to be treated as expenditures for arbitrage purposes.

The maximum tax bill per lot was set at \$5,000 at the June 25, 2010 public hearing. In accordance with City Ordinance 22-97.1, the initial tax bill for each of the thirteen (13) lots will be \$5,000 per lot. No deferred tax bills will be assessed. The sanitary sewer utility will fund the difference of \$463,941.10.

To date, \$577,029.88 has been assessed as deferred tax bills. The SD 165 Maple Bluff Drive project is not included in this number, as there are no tax bills being deferred on this project. There is \$1,422,970.12 remaining that may be assessed as deferred tax bills for future projects.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The construction cost to extend public sewer to the thirteen (13) properties was \$528,941.10, with \$65,000 being collected in tax bills, and the difference of \$463,941.10 being funded from sanitary sewer utility funds. It is anticipated that this project will have minimal impact on the sewer utility's operating cost annually.
