Executive Summary

Staff has prepared for Council consideration an ordinance authorizing the acquisition of property necessary for the construction of Alluvial Wells No.17 and 18 on a parcel of land on Starr School Road located approximately eleven hundred feet (1100') south of West Burr Oak Road. In addition, an ordinance is also being introduced authorizing the bidding of this project through the Purchasing Division. A public hearing for this project was held on February 4, 2013.

Discussion

The current McBaine well field has fifteen vertical wells, each capable of producing approximately 2 million gallons per day (MGD) with a theoretical peak pumping capacity from the well field of approximately 28 MGD with all wells in service. Due to the age of the wells, the partial plugging/fouling of the well screens and surrounding strata has reduced the actual pumping capacity of the well field to approximately 24.5 MGD.

At the time these three additional wells were programmed into the Capital Improvement Plan, the need for these three proposed wells was determined in order to provide a firm well field capacity of 32 MGD to match the raw water treatment capacity of the Water Treatment Plant with one standby well as recommended by the Missouri DNR Design Guide for Community Water Systems. Currently, due to the natural reduction in capacity of the existing 15 wells, the addition the three proposed wells will only return the well field to a design capacity of 28 MGD with one well in standby, thus falling short of the 32 MGD of firm water treatment capacity of the Plant.

Alluvial Well No.16 is proposed to be constructed on an existing city owned property currently occupied by existing Wells No. 11 and 12. One additional parcel of approximately 2.75 acres is proposed to be acquired in fee for the construction of Alluvial Wells No.17 and 18

Negotiations with property owners are expected to begin immediately after receiving Council approval for the property acquisition. A bid package is currently being prepared, and once the property has

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been acquired, construction of this project will be bid through the Purchasing Division as a design/build project.

Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: A total of \$1,030,000 has been appropriated in CIP projects WT0134 for Alluvial Well #16 and WT0138 for Alluvial Wells #17 and #18 from enterprise revenues and 2008 voter approved revenue bonds.

Long-Term Impact: Operational funds for the continued operation, maintenance, and upkeep of three additional wells will need to be considered in future operating budgets.

AN ORDINANCE

determining it is in the public interest to construct Alluvial Wells No. 16, No. 17 and No. 18 in the McBaine Bottoms; approving and adopting plans and specifications; determining that the work shall be done by contract; calling for bids through the Purchasing Division; providing for payment for the improvement; authorizing the City Manager to negotiate, obtain, execute and record all documents necessary for the improvement; providing for compliance with the prevailing wage law and state-mandated construction safety training; and fixing the time when this ordinance shall become effective.

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted a resolution declaring the necessity of constructing Alluvial Wells No. 16, No. 17 and No. 18 in the McBaine Bottoms; and

WHEREAS, the notice of a public hearing on this project was published in a daily newspaper of general circulation in the city; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has held a public hearing on construction of the improvement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Council finds that the construction of Alluvial Wells No. 16, No. 17 and No. 18 in the McBaine Bottoms in the City of Columbia, Missouri, is necessary for the welfare and improvement of the city and that it is in the public interest that such improvements be made.

SECTION 2. The plans and specifications for this improvement, as prepared by the Director of Water and Light, are hereby approved and made a part of this ordinance by reference.

SECTION 3. The construction of the improvement shall be done by contract in accordance with the plans and specifications, the laws of the State of Missouri, and the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Columbia, Missouri.

SECTION 4. The Purchasing Agent is hereby authorized to call for bids and execute a contract for the improvement.

SECTION 5. Payment for this improvement shall be made from the Water and Electric Fund using funds appropriated in Capital Improvement Project No. WT0134, water system improvement revenue bonds and such other funds as may be lawfully appropriated.

SECTION 6. The City Manager is authorized to negotiate, obtain, execute and have recorded all licenses, easements, deeds and any other conveyances or instruments necessary for the City to acquire the land, construct and operate the improvements authorized herein.

SECTION 7. The contract for the improvement shall provide that not less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages, as found by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations of Missouri, shall be paid to all workers performing work under the contract. The contractor's bond shall guarantee the faithful performance of the prevailing hourly wage clause in the contract.

SECTION 8. The bid specifications and contract for the improvement shall provide that the contractor and any subcontractor shall provide a ten-hour Occupational Safety and Health Administration construction safety program (or a similar program approved by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations) for all employees working on-site. All employees working on the site of the improvement are required to complete the safety program within 60 days of beginning work on the improvement project.

SECTION 9. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.



1300' Radius Well Buffer


