Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign Amendment #01 to the Healthy Eating Active Living in Local Communities contract between the City of Columbia and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services. Amendment #01 increases the contract by \$60,000. The total contract amount shall not exceed \$100,000 for the period of October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2015.

Discussion

This contract will allow Public Health and Human Services (PHHS) to implement evidence-based approaches for local environmental and system changes to increase healthy eating and physical activity. The original contract included projects to focusing on Missouri Live Well Restaurants, Missouri MOve Smart Early Childhood Education facilities, adding a bus shelter, and improving community gardens in the project area.

The funding with this amendment supports three additional projects: Breastfeeding Friendly Worksites, Stock Healthy Shop Healthy, and an Urban Agriculture feasibility study. PHHS plans to partner with Columbia Public Schools to develop a lactation policy and create lactation rooms in CPS buildings. Stock Healthy Shop Healthy is a program developed by MU Extension to increase access to healthy foods. PHHS plans to target rural areas on Boone County for this project. Finally PHHS will conduct a feasibility study of urban land to determine promising sites for urban agriculture.

Council's approval of this amendment enables further investment in public health and further implementation of the Community Health Improvement Plan.

AMENDMENT #01 TO Contract # AOC15380128

CONTRACT TITLE: Healthy Eating Active Living in Local Communities

CONTRACT PERIOD: October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2015

- 1. The Department of Health and Senior Services hereby increases the above referenced contract by \$60,000.00. The total available funding is \$100,000; therefore Section 1.1 is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with revised Section 1.1 as follows:
 - 1.1 The contract amount shall not exceed \$100,000 for the period of October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2015.
- 2. Add the following to section 3.0 Definitions:
 - 3.4 Small Food Retail Venue Small food retail venues are food stores that have limited physical space and, typically, a limited selection of foods. Different communities will have different names for these stores, including corner stores, convenience stores, town groceries, gas stations, dollar stores and neighborhood stores. Restaurants are not considered small food retail venue for the purpose of this contract.
- 3. Add the following to section 4.0 Deliverables and Outcomes:
 - 4.8 The Contractor shall implement activities designed to increase access to healthy foods in at least two small food retail venues in their service area.
 - 4.8.1 The Contractor shall receive training and technical assistance from the University of Missouri Extension to assist implementation of their small food retail project.
 - 4.8.2 The Contractor shall utilize the Stock Healthy, Shop Healthy program materials, which can be found here: http://extension.missouri.edu/stockhealthy/home.aspx. Any changes must be approved through University of Missouri Extension TA providers (Extension TA provider) or the Department.
 - 4.8.3 The Contractor shall identify at least 5 community stakeholders to form a network of partners that will assist with implementation of this project.
 - 4.8.3.1 The Contractor is encouraged to include youth as members of their community network.
 - 4.8.4 The Contractor shall work with the Extension TA provider to identify potential retail venues to include.
 - 4.8.5 The Contractor shall participate in evaluation of their small food retail venue project using the evaluation tools provided and as led by the Extension TA provider.

- 4.8.6 The Contractor shall conduct activities within their service community to increase awareness about the availability of healthy foods in small retail venues and to increase the knowledge and skills of potential customers for utilizing healthy foods.
- 4. Delete Section 6.4 in its entirety and replace with revised Section 6.4 as follows:
 - Administrative costs billed to the Department shall not exceed the amount stated in Attachment E and are limited to 8% of the direct contract cost <u>billed</u>. Administrative costs are those associated with the management and oversight of an organization's activities. The Contractor is not required to submit supporting documentation to the Department.
- 5. Delete Attachment C and Attachment E in their entirety and replace with revised Attachment C and Attachment E attached hereto and incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.

All other terms, conditions and provisions of the contract shall remain the same and apply hereto.

Budget Justification

Personnel: All of the personnel expenses are being provided in-kind.

Coordinator: Health Promotion Supervisor (10 hours per week + benefits) = 16,000

Additional Staff: Senior Planner (2 hours per week + benefits) = 3,500

Health Educator (15 hours per week + benefits) = 21,000

WIC Supervisor (5 hours per week + benefits) = 8,000

Travel: Travel cost include monthly auto reimbursement for PHHS to reimburse for mileage used while driving to ECE facilities, restaurants, community garden meetings, Stock Healthy Shop Healthy sites and meetings, Feasibility study sites and meetings, breastfeeding friendly sites and meetings, and North Central Neighborhood Association meetings.

Monthly auto reimbursement (\$153.33 per month x 12 months) = \$1,840 Mileage reimbursement is requested for ECE facility staff members to attend trainings if desired as part of the MOve Smart Missouri requirements. In addition, mileage reimbursement is requested for "Stock Healthy Shop Healthy" training or any other training relevant to the contract.

Mileage reimnbursement (\$40 per training x 10 ECE staff trained) + (\$40 per training x 2 staff x 2 trainings) = \$560

Supplies and Equipment: ECE facilities require approximately \$2,000 in active play equipment per site. See the following attachment for an example equipment estimate for a ECE facility.

ECE Facilities = (\$2,000 for active play equipment x 5 sites) = \$10,000

Live Well Restaurants requires printing costs, food analysis software, and advertisement costs.

Printing for menus, table tents, and posters = $(500 \times 10 \text{ restaurants}) = $5,000 \text{ Food analysis software} = 960

Advertisement costs = \$5,000 (includes Facebook ads and radio ads)

Bus stop shelter cost include the cost of purchasing the physical structure. The estimate is provided by the City of Columbia transit department.

Bus stop shelter = \$8,000

The water supply expenses for the community garden include the cost of either connecting the garden to the city water line or creating a sustainable rain water system. This estimate is based on previous water supply/community garden projects.

Water line/rain water system = 7,000

The Breastfeeding Friendly worksites would include the creation of 30 lactation rooms (one in each of the Columbia Public School buildings). The rooms include a refrigerator for milk storage, a brochure rack for lactation information, a comfortable rocking chair, a small table, a lamp, and a multiuser breast pump.

Lactation room equipment = $(30 \text{ rooms } \times \$1,000) = \$30,000$

Stock Healthy Shop Healthy costs will include the cost of purchasing any necessary equipment or shelving, food tasting, advertising, a consultant, and the printing of surveys.

Stock Healthy Shop Health = (\$1,000 for food tasting/miscellaneous + \$5,000 for shelving and equipment + 2,000 for consultant + 1,500 for advertising + 500 for printing) = \$10,000

PHHS plans to subcontract with the Center for Urban Agricultural to conduct a feasibility study on public lands to determine possible locations for urban agricultural including community garden, urban farms, edible landscaping etc. Center for Urban Agricultural will also create community engagement through community meetings and publicity.

Subcontract = Feasibility study (Center for Urban Agricultural) = \$8,000 PHHS plans to subcontract with an agency to create at least one community garden. Agencies will apply for the subcontract funds and PHHS will determine who receives the funding with the help of the healthy lifestyles action team. Agencies can also apply to create plant edible landscaping.

Subcontract = creating a new garden (Community Garden Coalition) = \$5,040
