Executive Summary

The City recently launched SpeakUpCoMo.com, an online engagement platform from Granicus. The first campaign on SpeakUpCoMo addressed the proposed projects for the August 2015 Capital Improvement Sales Tax renewal. Two forums were used: one to gather votes and comments on proposed projects, and another to gather citizen ideas for projects they would like to see on the ballot.

The campaign was open from 5/1/2015 to 5/15/2015. Council was provided the results on 5/15/2015 in advance of the vote for the proposed Capital Improvement Sales Tax renewal.

Hi David, Thanks for the question. You are right. The gray area represents areas in the city limits that are outside the 4 min travel time. While density is certainly a concern for Fire, geographic growth is what this particular map is concerned with. Travel time is based on how long it would take a fire truck to get to an area from a fire station on the current road network. CFD still responds to areas outside of the green area, they just fall outside of the recommend 4 minute travel time. There is an agreement between the Fire District and CFD to handle calls for service that fall between service areas.
