### **Executive Summary**

Appropriating Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) grant funds, in the amount of \$6,694,837, for the design, rehabilitation and extension of Runway 13-31 and partial Taxiway Bravo, with Bid Schedule I construction funding for the east side of Runway 13-31, installation of guidance signs and lighting, at the Columbia Regional Airport.

#### Discussion

Currently, two large FAA related construction projects, authorized by Council, are underway at the Columbia Regional Airport.

- 1) FAA Grant #39: The reconstruction of Runway 13-31 and Taxiway B, at the intersection of Runway 20, including installation of a new lighting system, directional signage and pavement centerline and runway markings.
- 2) FAA Grant #41: Construction services for the relocation of Rangeline Road due to the lengthening of Runway 13-31 and associated parallel Taxiway B to 5,500 feet. The Rangeline Road relocation construction project is scheduled for spring of 2016.

The FAA has recently notified staff that it intends to provide funding for design and construction of the rehabilitation and extension of Runway 13-31 and partial Taxiway Bravo (future FAA Grant #40), with Bid Schedule I construction funding for the east side of Runway 13-31. Design services will be provided by Burns & McDonnell Engineering, who was awarded a 5-year airport engineering services contract in 2011. It is anticipated that a Bid Schedule II construction project grant will be issued in FY17 to completely fund the entire Runway 13-31 reconstruction project. The attached map depicts the locations for Bid Schedule I and II.

The FAA Airport Capital Improvement Plan of 2015, projects the reconstruction of Runway 13-31 in CY17. The total cost of this new project is estimated at \$14,996,454, with FAA funding \$13,496,809 (90%) and \$1,499,645 (10%) local match. Although the FAA has not yet provided the City with a

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grant agreement for Grant #40, they have provided the attached Letter of Intent, and staff is appropriating the FAA grant funds for Bid Schedule I to the project account. Transportation Sales Tax funds for the City's local match have already been appropriated to the project.

### Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: The estimated cost for FAA Grant #40 project, Bid Schedule I, is \$7,438,708. The FAA will reimburse the City 90%, or \$6,694,837. The City's local match is \$743,871, and is being paid from Transportation Sales Tax funds.

Long-Term Impact: The estimated cost for Bid Schedule II, projected for a grant offer in FY2017 is \$7,557,746, with FAA reimbursing the City 90% of this cost.

### **Suggested Council Action**

Authorize the appropriation of FAA grant funds, in the amount of \$6,694,837, for the design, rehabilitation and extension of Runway 13-31 and partial Taxiway Bravo, with Bid Schedule I construction funding for the east side of Runway 13-31 project at the Columbia Regional Airport.
