SECTION 1 - RESPONSIBILITIES OF CITY

- 1.1 The CITY will provide the services as described below, hereinafter called the SERVICES, consisting of the following:
 - a. Columbia Transit will provide transportation services via the Gold Route for *Campus View Apartments*. Residents of *Campus View Apartments* will have free access to the Gold Route for the University of Missouri Fall and Winter semesters.
 - a.1 2012/2013 (August 2012 December 2012 (Fall Semester) and January 2013 May 2013 (Winter Semester)).
- 1.2 SERVICES shall follow the posted University of Missouri semester schedule and will only be operated when the University of Missouri Shuttle Service is in operation.
- 1.3 SERVICES shall not be provided during scheduled holiday, summer semesters and/or semester breaks at the University of Missouri.
- 1.4 SERVICES shall not be provided when University of Missouri cancels classes due to weather or other unforeseen emergencies.
- 1.5 SERVICES are provided on a first come first serve basis for all residents. Proper bus operations and safety standards will be observed at all times.
- 1.6 SERVICES are provided from **6:40 AM to 5:40 PM Monday thru Friday running** one complete cycle every thirty (30) minutes.

SECTION 2 - PAYMENT FOR SERVICES PROVIDED

- 2.1 For services performed, the PROPERTY shall pay the CITY the sum of \$13,715 per semester (as described above) for a total of \$27,430.
- 2.2 Payment is due within thirty (30) days from the date of invoice.
- 2.2.1 PROPERTY will be mailed an invoice at the beginning of each semester of service as described above.
- 2.3 Should PROPERTY fail to make payment as set out herein the CITY may suspend services immediately or at its option terminate this agreement.

SECTION 3 - GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS

3.1 Entire Agreement

This Agreement represents the entire Agreement between the PROPERTY and CITY. All previous or contemporaneous agreements, representations, promises and conditions relating to the provided service described herein are superseded.

- 3.2 Neither CITY nor PROPERTY shall assign, sublet, or transfer its interest in this agreement without the written consent of the other.
- 3.3 This Agreement is for the benefit of the parties only and not for the benefit of any third party.
- 3.4 If Columbia Transit does not provide all services, as provided for in the contract, for any separate five (5) days in a single semester, except for instances allowed for in the contract; the PROPERTY has the right to terminate the contract.
- 3.5 The CITY shall not sell additional passes for Gold Route service to Campus View residents at or on the Campus View property. The CITY does not sell Gold Route only passes, except as part of a contract with a designated apartment complex.

Gold Route Apartment Agreements for 2012/2013 School Year

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Staff has prepared for Council consideration a resolution authorizing agreements for transportation services to two of the large multi-unit housing complexes along Old Highway 63 and South Providence. Columbia Transit provides transportation service, via the Gold Route, to the apartment complexes in that area. The Gold route has been very successful, with a total ridership of 649,119 during the 2011/2012 school year.

DISCUSSION:

Columbia Transit provides public transportation service to several apartment complexes along Old Highway 63, which cater primarily to college students. These complexes enable their tenants to board the bus, free at the farebox, by contracting with the City. Semester passes are provided to the complexes to issue to their tenants. Any other transit rider pays the normal applicable fare as they board the bus or may purchase an applicable pass from Columbia Transit. Services are only provided during the University of Missouri's fall and spring semesters; no summer service is provided.

In January of 2012, Columbia Transit staff met with management of the apartment complexes along the Black and Gold routes and proposed that each complex pay \$62.34 per bed, per semester, as an equitable method of recouping costs for the routes. Both Campus View and *The Pointe* signed one year term agreements for service during the 2012/13 school year, at \$62.34 per bed. Staff is in the process of finalizing two additional contracts, for a total of four, which allows Columbia Transit better planning opportunities and the ability to more efficiently manage its resources.

This new contract fee represents a significant change over previous agreements. There were no previous contracts with *The Pointe* and *Campus View*, but informal agreements to purchase small groups of semester passes. Contracts with these large complexes enable Columbia Transit to provide services to this high-density corridor. The combined contractual fees do not pay all associated operational expenses, but do significantly increase the revenue for these routes. In addition, they allow Columbia Transit to provide a service which removes hundreds of private cars from the City roadways each day; more specifically the Old Highway 63 and Stadium Blvd, and Providence Road and Stadium Blvd, intersections. This has been a very successful public/private partnership. The Public Works department will soon be hiring a Marketing Specialist to continue marketing, and negotiating contracts, for service to additional complexes.

The passes issued to these complexes, via contract, will be accepted on all routes. The passes will be fraudresistant semester passes, similar to the current FastPasses.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Campus View Drive, LLC will be paying the City \$13,715 (220 beds x \$62.34) per academic semester, or \$27,430 per school year. Rock Quarry Properties LLC, will pay the City \$14,962 (240 beds x \$62.34) per academic semester, or \$29,924 per school year.
