Re: Boards, Commissions, Committees and Task Forces

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

In July, 2009, Council expressed concern regarding the appointment process with regard to its boards, commissions, committees and task forces. As a result, staff provided the Council a list of existing volunteer groups along with their establishing legislation in December, 2009. Council asked the volunteer groups to complete a questionnaire and the results of those questionnaires were provided to them. Council then asked staff to provide a grouping of volunteer groups with similar duties/tasks, and Council tasked itself to reviewing duties and work functions for potential improvement. The results were distributed to the Council as a whole, and Council asked staff to research the issue and provide further feedback. A report was provided to Council in December, 2011, and based on that report, the Council asked staff to communicate with each volunteer group regarding the recommendation made in that report. The boards, commissions, committees and task forces were contacted in January, 2012 and asked to provide feedback on the suggestions of staff by May, 2012. Staff reviewed the information submitted by the volunteer groups and conducted further research, and is suggesting the following changes.

DISCUSSION:

Airport Advisory Board: The Airport Advisory Board suggests adding a REDI member to the Board as an ex-officio non-voting member similar to the Missouri CORE position. Staff agrees with this recommendation. Staff recommends removing the Missouri CORE Partnership, Inc. ex-officio non-voting member from the Airport Advisory Board. The structure of CORE has changed and representative of this organization has not been able to participate in a meeting since last year.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance with these changes to its membership.

Armory Board: This Board has not had an active membership for over ten years.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to eliminate the Armory Board.

Bicycle/Pedestrian Commission: Staff recommends removing the Planning and Zoning Commission liaison position from this Commission even though the Bicycle/Pedestrian Commission would prefer to maintain the relationship as this was recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to remove the Planning and Zoning Commission liaison position from the Bicycle/Pedestrian Commission. Since this action would reduce the number of members to ten, the Council might also want to consider removing the Parks and Recreation Commission liaison, so membership would be nine - an odd number again. This could be referred to the Parks and Recreation Commission for its thoughts.

Board of Electrical Examiners; Board of Mechanical Examiners and Board of Plumbing Examiners: The primary responsibilities of these trade boards, which are not legally required, include giving examinations for licenses and certificates, approving and/or disapproving applications for licenses and certificates and issuing or revoking licenses and certificates. Staff recommends a combined trade board consisting of five members at this time. Those members would consist of a master mechanic, a master plumber, a master electrician, a general contractor not engaged in HVACR, plumbing or electrical work and a layperson, which would be defined as someone not engaged in HVACR, plumbing or electrical work. The main reasons for these recommendations include issues involving the lack of a full membership on these boards and lack of quorums at meetings. ***Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to eliminate the Board of Electrical Examiners, Board of Mechanical Examiners and the Board of Plumbing Examiners, and direct staff to prepare an ordinance to create a Building Trades Board as described.***

Building Construction Codes Commission: This Board has a membership of ten regular and ten alternate members, and it has been a challenge to fill all twenty positions. Staff recommends reducing the number of regular members to seven and to eliminate the need for any alternate members. Those members would consist of (1) a master electrician or professional engineer experienced in electrical work; (2) a master mechanic, master plumber or a professional engineer experienced in mechanical/plumbing work; (3) a professional engineer experienced in structural/civil work; (4) a major contractor, minor contractor or superintendent; (5) a registered architect; (6) a residential rental property owner; and (7) a layperson, which would need to be defined.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to reduce the number of members on the Building Construction Codes Commission as described.

C.A.R.E. Advisory Board: Staff recommends eliminating this Board. There have been issues obtaining quorums for meetings, and rarely is there ever full attendance at a meeting. The duties of the Board are to (1) advise the Council in matters pertaining to the C.A.R.E. program; (2) make recommendations to staff regarding the operation of the C.A.R.E. program; and (3) promote the C.A.R.E. program to current and prospective employers. Staff can advise the Council in matters pertaining to the C.A.R.E. program and can continue making improvements in its operations. Staff could call upon people that support the C.A.R.E. program on an as needed or ad-hoc basis to promote the program as they do this to a certain extent now.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to eliminate the C.A.R.E. Advisory Board.

Columbia Special Business District Board: The Downtown Community Improvement District (CID) has essentially taken over the duties of this Board, and the Special Business District has not collected any tax revenue this year and had planned on spending money from previous years this fiscal year, which ends September 30, so the recommendation of staff is to either remove this Board from the City's Code of Ordinances or show it as being suspended through the life of the Downtown CID, which is twenty years.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to eliminate or suspend the Columbia Special Business District Board.

Columbia Vision Commission: Staff recommends reviewing the establishing legislation to refresh the mission, membership structure, nomination/application process, etc. Staff feels: (1) the mission should be refreshed due to the strategic planning process; (2) the membership structure should be simplified so resource and liaison member positions are eliminated as our understanding is that there are no current resource or liaison members; and (3) the nomination process is removed as no one has nominated a commission member since this Commission was established.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance that would revise the legislation establishing/governing the Columbia Vision Commission.

Community Cooperation Board: This Board has not had an active membership for over ten years.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to eliminate the Community Cooperation Board.

Downtown Columbia Leadership Council: Staff does not recommend any further changes. A Downtown Community Improvement District representative is now on the Downtown Columbia Leadership Council so there is some overlap in terms of coordination.

No Council action is needed.

Environment and Energy Commission: Staff recommends removing the Planning and Zoning Commission liaison position from this Commission even though the Environment and Energy Commission would prefer to maintain the relationship as this was recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission. Staff is no longer recommending the Environment and Energy Commission take on the duties of a landscape/tree board as staff currently handles the suggested responsibilities through the City Arborist and the fact that Columbia participates in the Tree City USA program. Staff understands this is acceptable to the Environment and Energy Commission as the Commission met with the City Arborist after submitting its comments.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to remove the Planning and Zoning Commission liaison position from the Environment and Energy Commission. Since this action would reduce the number of members to ten, the Council might also want to consider adding another general member to be appointed by the City Council so the number of members remains at eleven.

GetAbout Columbia: Non-Motorized Transportation Pilot Project Advisory Committee: Staff recommends eliminating this Committee, which was established when the City first received federal non-motorized transportation funding, as it has not met this year, and had only met twice last year. In addition, it was not officially established through an ordinance, resolution or motion at a Council Meeting. The Bicycle/Pedestrian Commission can incorporate the work of this Committee as its duties already include working with administration in the preparation and submission of yearly grant requests and developing/implementing the bike master plan as money becomes available according to priorities based on need and the cost of the routes. In addition, staff has already been working with the Bicycle/Pedestrian Commission in terms of planning for the most recent non-motorized grant received. Any current member of GetAbout Columbia could stay involved by providing comments to the Bicycle/Pedestrian Commission of upcoming issues/items or could apply for membership to that Commission when a vacancy became available.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to eliminate the GetAbout Columbia: Non-Motorized Transportation Pilot Project Advisory Committee.

Historic Preservation Commission: Staff did not recommend any changes in its prior review. The Historic Preservation Commission, however, suggested cross appointments involving the Planning and Zoning Commission and the Building Construction Codes Commission. Staff is suggesting eliminating other cross appointments involving the Planning and Zoning Commission, so it does not feel another cross appointment should be added. Staff is suggesting the Building Construction Codes Commission be restructured, and a current member of the Historic Preservation Commission could always apply to be on the Building Construction Codes Commission as long as it met the requirement for membership to that Commission. Staff supports the idea of more formal communication, and feels that could be accomplished through correspondence and occasional joint meetings if all parties are agreeable.

No Council action is needed.

Internet Citizens Advisory Group: Staff recommends eliminating this Group. There have been issues obtaining quorums for meetings, and rarely is there ever full attendance at a meeting. This primary function of this group is to recommend resource priority for the City's effective utilization of the internet and to serve as a focus group in terms of the user friendliness and effectiveness of the City's internet site/activities. Staff already places a priority in terms of the utilization of the internet and the members of this group could continue to participate in focus groups on an ad-hoc basis along with members from the general public for a larger focus group.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to eliminate the Internet Citizens Advisory Group.

Mayor's Committee on Physical Fitness: Staff recommends re-establishing this Committee through ordinance in an effort to formalize the Committee since it is funded through the Council budget and will continue its work indefinitely. The ordinance can incorporate an official change to the Committee's name as it has gone by the Mayor's Council on Physical Fitness and Health for years, a change to its membership in terms of the number of participants and/or their terms, its duties, etc.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance that would re-establish the Mayor's Committee on Physical Fitness by the name it goes by and accommodate other necessary details or changes.

Parks and Recreation Commission: Staff does not recommend any changes. There was discussion with regard to merging the Boone County Parks and Recreation Commission with the Columbia Parks and Recreation Commission, but the Columbia Parks and Recreation Commission recommended against that change. The Columbia Parks and Recreation Commission was agreeable to adding a non-voting liaison from the Boone County Parks and Recreation Commission to the Columbia Parks and Recreation Commission or for the Commissions to hold a joint meetings at least annually or bi-annually to discuss broader issues. Staff prefers the idea of joint meetings on an as-needed basis.

No Council action is needed.

Personnel Advisory Board: The Board has changed its mind since providing its original recommendation a few months ago. It now recommends (1) adding two alternate members to serve in place of regular members that might not be able to attend and keeping the quorum at five to help attain a quorum for short notice personnel hearings; (2) to remove Section 19-23(c)(5) of the Code of Ordinances as that responsibility is unclear; and (3) update the personnel advisory board appeal procedures (Section 19-239), specifically when it comes to the hearing process. It no longer desires to formally require a vice chair through an ordinance change as it can elect a vice chair without the change. Staff agrees with the changes requested.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance for changes to the Personnel Advisory Board to address items (1) and (2) above. Item (3) is being worked on by staff in conjunction with the labor groups, so it is not necessary for Council to direct staff to prepare an ordinance with changes to Section 19-239 unless they wanted to have some formal action on record.

Planning and Zoning Commission: Staff recommends removing the liaison requirements of the Planning and Zoning Commission on the Bicycle/Pedestrian Commission and the Environment and Energy Commission.

No Council action is needed as these changes were included with the discussion of the Bicycle/Pedestrian Commission and Environment and Energy Commission.

Public Communications Resource Advisory Committee: Staff recommends eliminating this Committee. One of the primary duties of this Committee was to review applications and recommend funding for public communications services that will enhance the ability of Columbia citizens to learn about community issues and communicate with government officials, but this Committee no longer has funds available to recommend to Council to allocate, so the need for this Committee really does not exist. The Committee has not met since June of 2011.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to eliminate the Public Communications Resource Advisory Committee.

Public Transportation Advisory Commission: Staff recommends against a global transportation advisory commission at this time, and recommends a change to the name of this Commission to the Public Transit Advisory Commission, a review of the Commission duties and reconstituting membership of the Commission, so there is an emphasis on transit, and includes a paratransit rider as well as college student representatives. A membership similar to that of the Transit System Task Force could be incorporated, and that Task Force could then be eliminated.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to make the suggested changes to the Public Transportation Advisory Commission, which include changes in the name of the Commissions, its duties and its membership, and eliminate the Transit System Task Force once an ordinance change is made to the Commission.

Storm Water Advisory Commission: This Commission was established to review and recommend changes to the storm water ordinance, which it has done. The ordinance with changes recommended by the Commission and staff was introduced at the August 20, 2012 Council Meeting, and can be passed by Council at the September 4, 2012 Council Meeting. A task force could be established if/when future needs/reviews are warranted.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to eliminate the Storm Water Advisory Commission as its mission has been accomplished.

U.S.S. Columbia Commissioning Committee: Staff recommends eliminating this Committee as it is not reflective of a board or commission in terms of appointments being made by the Mayor/Council and is not central or tangential to the City's mission. The Committee should be its own service organization. If Council disagrees with this recommendation, this Committee should then be reconstituted by legislation, specifying the role of this Committee, the number of members it should include, the number of members that would constitute a quorum, the appointment process, etc.

Council should direct staff to prepare an ordinance to eliminate the U.S.S. Columbia Commissioning Committee.

Landscape/Tree Board: This was a recommendation of the Vision Report, but staff is not recommending the creation of this Board because these issues are being addressed by the City's Arborist and as part of the City's participation in the Tree City USA Program.

No Council action is needed.

Intercultural Council: This was a recommendation of the Vision Report, but staff is not recommending the creation of this Council because these issues are being addressed through other efforts, such as through the mission of sister cities and the annual diversity celebration.

No Council action is needed.

Land Preservation Authority: This was a recommendation of the Vision Report, and staff is recommending this be combined with the Natural Resources Committee, and consist of already established organizations, such

as the City of Columbia, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Conservation, Boone County, the Greenbelt Coalition, etc.

No Council action is needed.

Regional Science and Technology Network: This was a recommendation of the Vision Report, but staff is not recommending the creation of this group because these issues are being pursued by REDI/the City's Economic Development Department.

No Council action is needed.

Community Educational Facilities Commission: This was a recommendation of the Vision Report, but staff is not recommending the creation of this Commission because these issues are being addressed by the Columbia Public School Board.

No Council action is needed.

Natural Resources Committee: This was a recommendation of the Vision Report, and staff is recommending this group be combined with the Land Preservation Authority, and consist of already established organizations, such as the City of Columbia, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Conservation, Boone County, the Greenbelt Coalition, etc.

No Council action is needed.

Transportation Advisory Commission: This was a recommendation of the Vision Report, but staff is not recommending the creation of this Commission due to the feedback received against this idea by the existing volunteer groups that would potentially be involved, and staff agrees.

No Council action is needed.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Unknown, but likely a savings in staff time in some situations.
