# I. <u>ADMINISTRATION</u>

- A. Oakland Park Contractor (James Fencing) replaced 230 ' of the ballfield fence and 500' of fence fabric damaged by vandalism.
- B. <u>Stephens Lake Park</u> Contractor (James Fencing) completed installation of the beach fence, with the exception of the construction access point.
- C. <u>Hickman High School</u> Contractor (Anchor Fence) has replaced 355' of fence and two gates at the tennis courts.
