I. <u>ADMINISTRATION</u>

- A. <u>MKT Bridge #12</u> Houf Construction has poured 95% of all concrete.
- B. <u>Smiley Lane Park</u> Stockman Construction completed construction of the cul-desac off of Jackal Drive.
- C. <u>Stephens Amphitheater</u> Richardson Excavation removed all excess soil from the seating area and moved entry boulders to allow better access.
- D. <u>Douglass Sprayground</u> Westport Pools poured the concrete pad, set the aboveground pieces on the pad, and substantially completed the plumbing inside the pool building.
- E. <u>Cosmo-Bethel Tennis Courts</u> Tom Adair Construction constructed 275 lineal feet of 5' sidewalk and the steps from the shelter down to the four new east tennis courts.
- F. <u>Capen Park</u> Richardson Excavation completed backfilling the parking lot curbs with mulch from the Capen mulch site.
- G. <u>Rock Quarry Park</u> Richardson Excavation completed the grading work in preparation for the sidewalk construction and began backfilling the new basketball and tennis courts.
- H. Interested Parties Meetings
 - 1. Twin Lakes Dog Park Held public meeting to get input on winter dog park area and proposed dog park rules on April 13.
