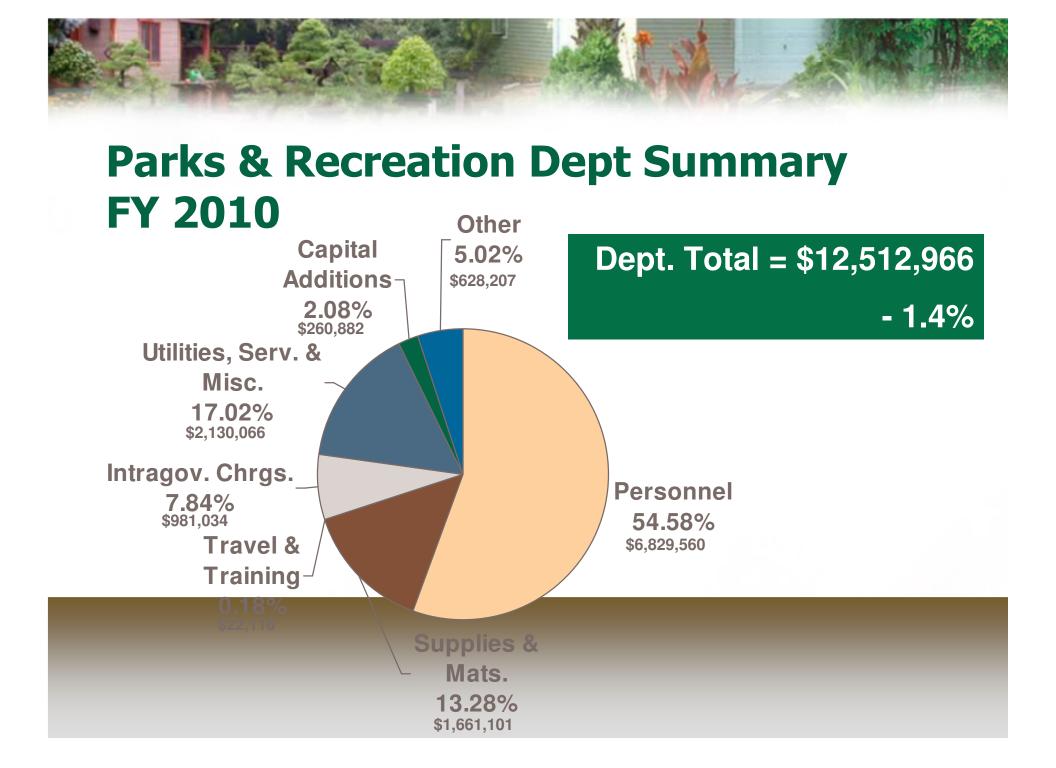

### **General Fund**

• Provides parks, trails, facilities, and services available to all. No fees or charges for these services.

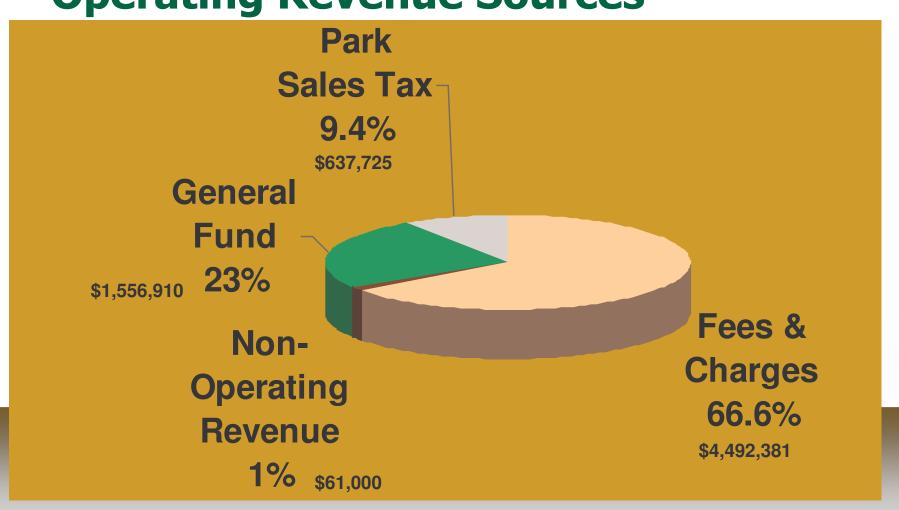
#### **Recreation Services Fund**

- Services provided for which users bear a portion or all of the cost.
- Subsidized programs (youth sports, aquatics, at-risk youth, seniors, Special Olympics, etc.)
- Includes maintenance of enterprise facilities (athletic complexes, aquatics, golf

courses, and ARC).

### **Recreation Services Budget**

#### Includes:

- \$1,556,910 General Fund Subsidy
  - Decrease of \$149,000 from FY 09 to FY 10
- \$637,735 Park Sales Tax Subsidy
  - No increase over FY 2009
- \$1,587,818 of Park Services
   Division maintenance support for golf, athletic fields, aquatics, and special events



 Decrease of \$15,508 from FY 09 to FY 10



### Significant Budget Changes

#### **General Fund**

- Decrease in supplies and materials primarily due to decreased fuel costs and reduction in number of trees planted. Total decrease (-\$87,347).
- Decrease in temporary staff due to decreased mowing frequency and reduction in tree planting program (-\$11,280).
- Decrease in pass-through sponsorship funds. \$1500 reduction each to Boone Co. Historical Society, First Night, and Senior Show-Me Games.
- C.A.R.E. budget decreased to FY 2008 budget level for summer trainees (185).
- Increase in capital equipment budget (+46,287)
- Increase in intra-governmental charges, primarily self insurance fees and information technology fees (+\$10,987).



### Significant Budget Changes (continued)

#### **Recreation Services Fund**

- Elimination of the vacant Recreation Supervisor position in the Life Enrichment/50+/Special Events section (-\$74,002).
- Eliminated Recreation Specialist position in the Golf/Concessions program (-\$74,763).
- Reduction in temporary salaries of approximately \$100,000.
- Materials and supplies reduced by 7.1% (-\$77,177).
- Miscellaneous contractual services decreased by approximately 10% (-\$39,400).
- Increase in capital projects of \$225,000. Recreation Services User Fees are proposed to fund the renovation of American Legion Park (\$200,000) and help fund the replacement of the Hickman swimming pool roof (\$25,000).
- Proposed fee increases in numerous recreation programs and activities (see following summary).
