- Current Uses: Office space/new construction

5. Conley Road—West Highway 63

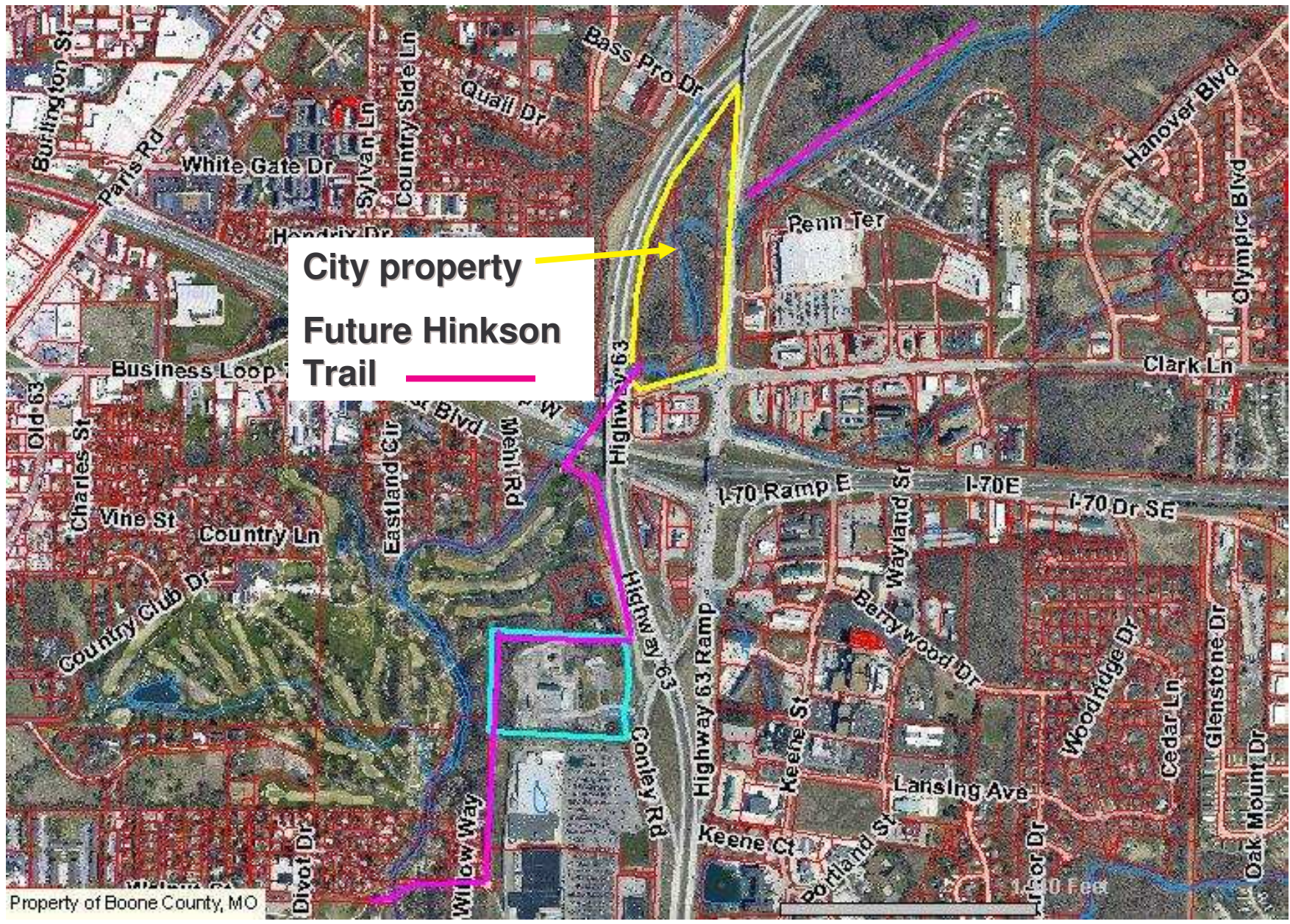
- Site: 18.31 acres

- Current Use: Former MO DOT highway storage and work station.

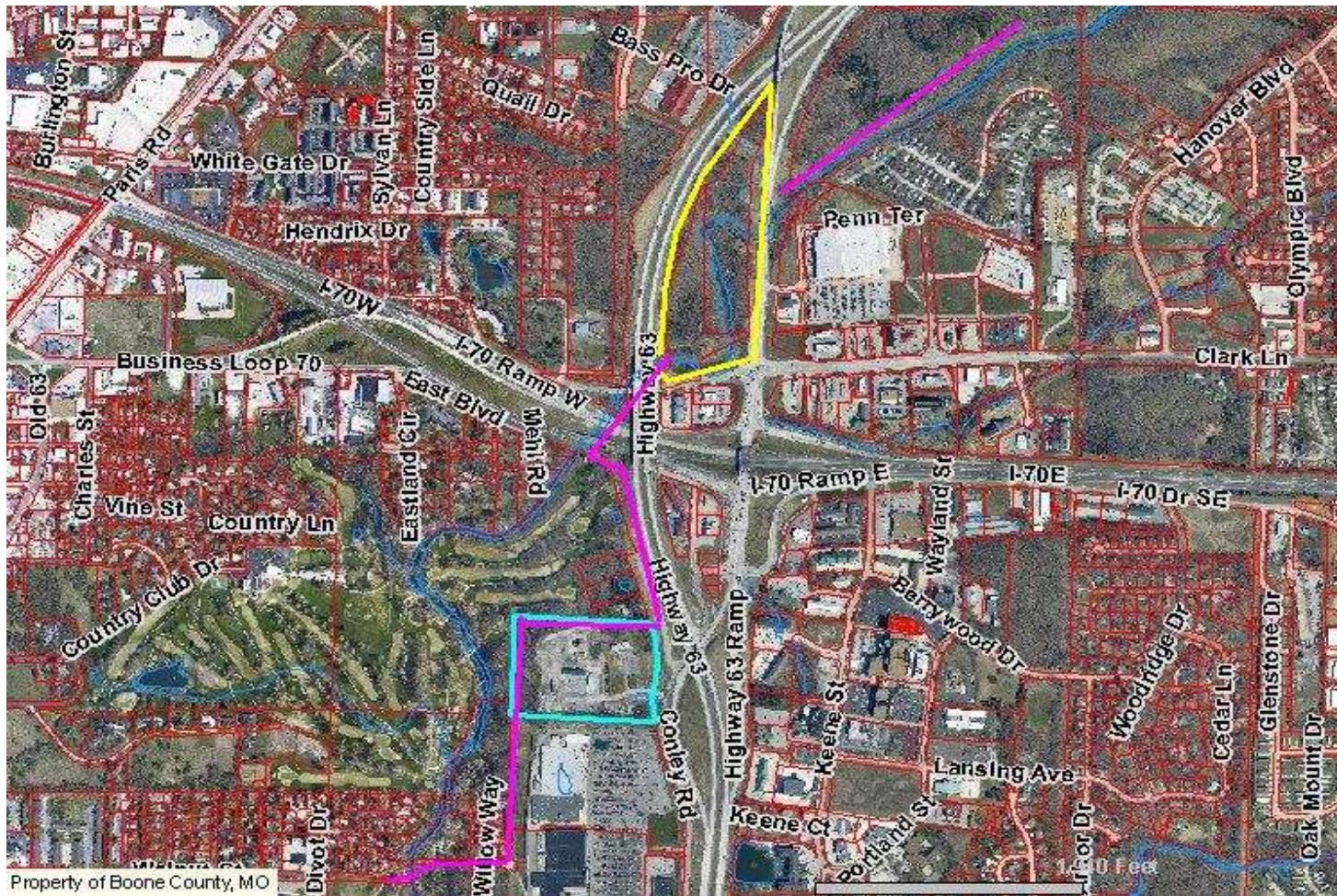

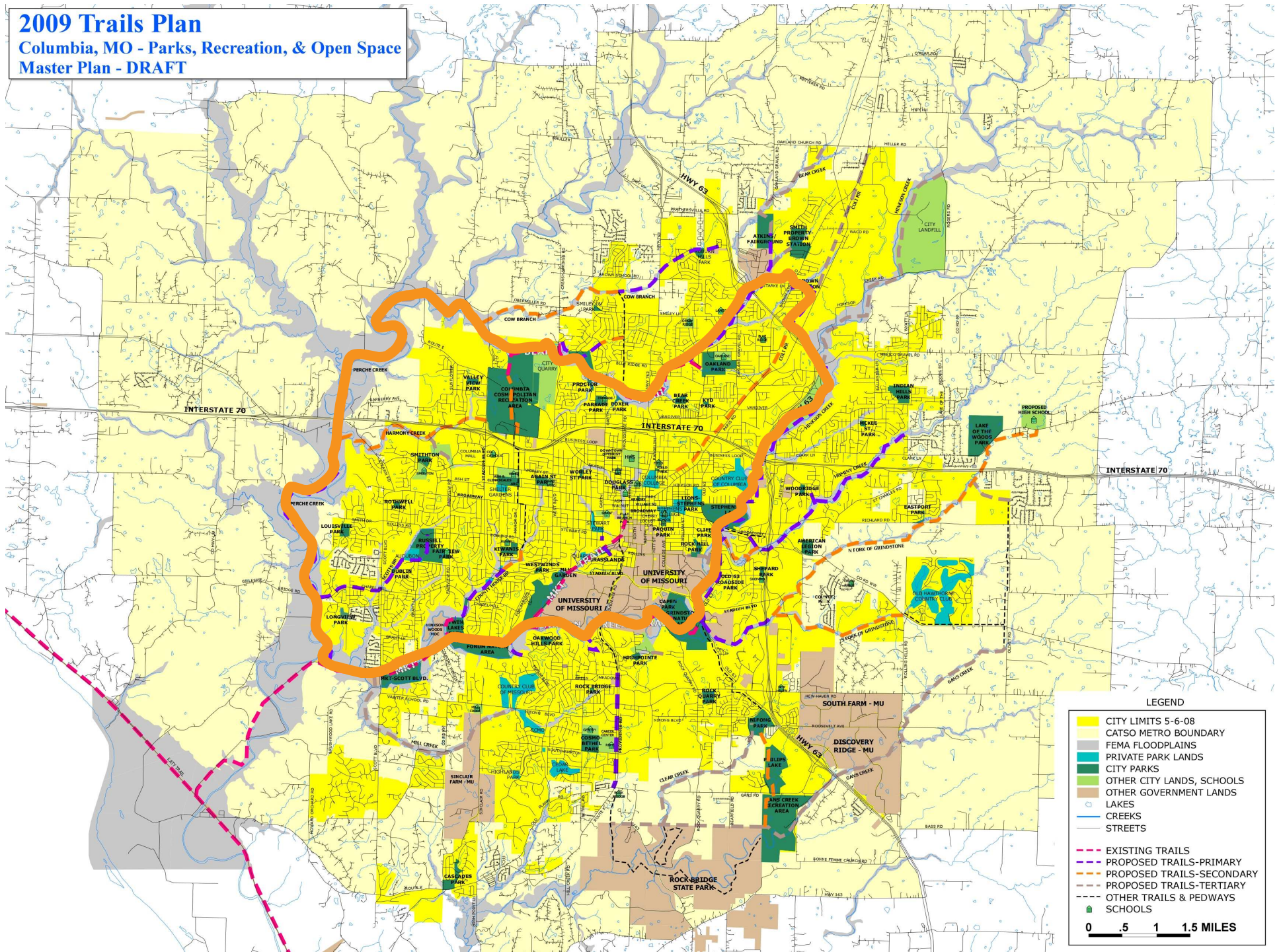

fence and gate.

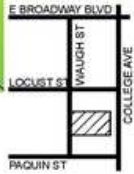




GARDEN AREA ENLARGEMENT

TLRA Dog Park

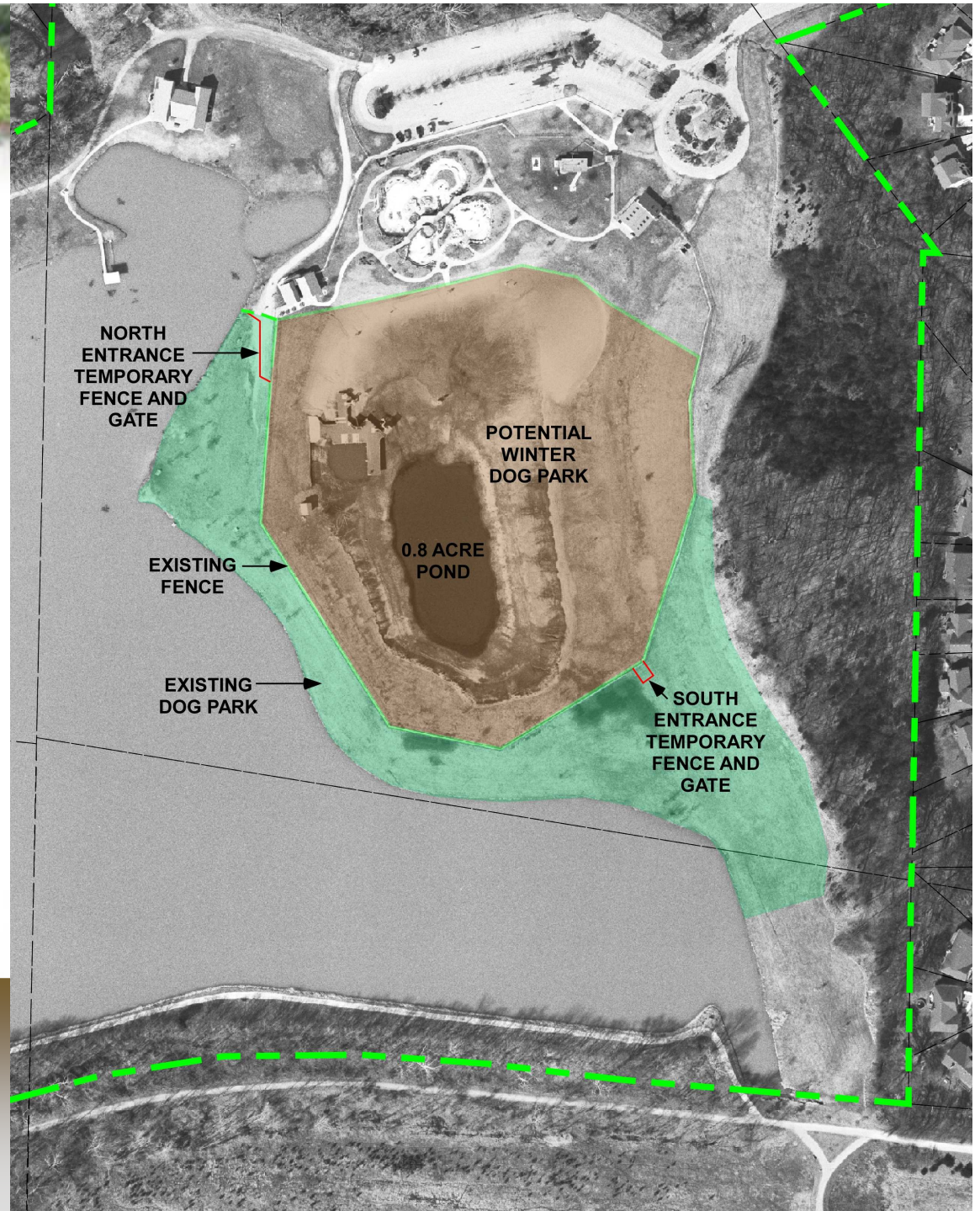
- 26-acre lake poses problems in winter when ice forms.

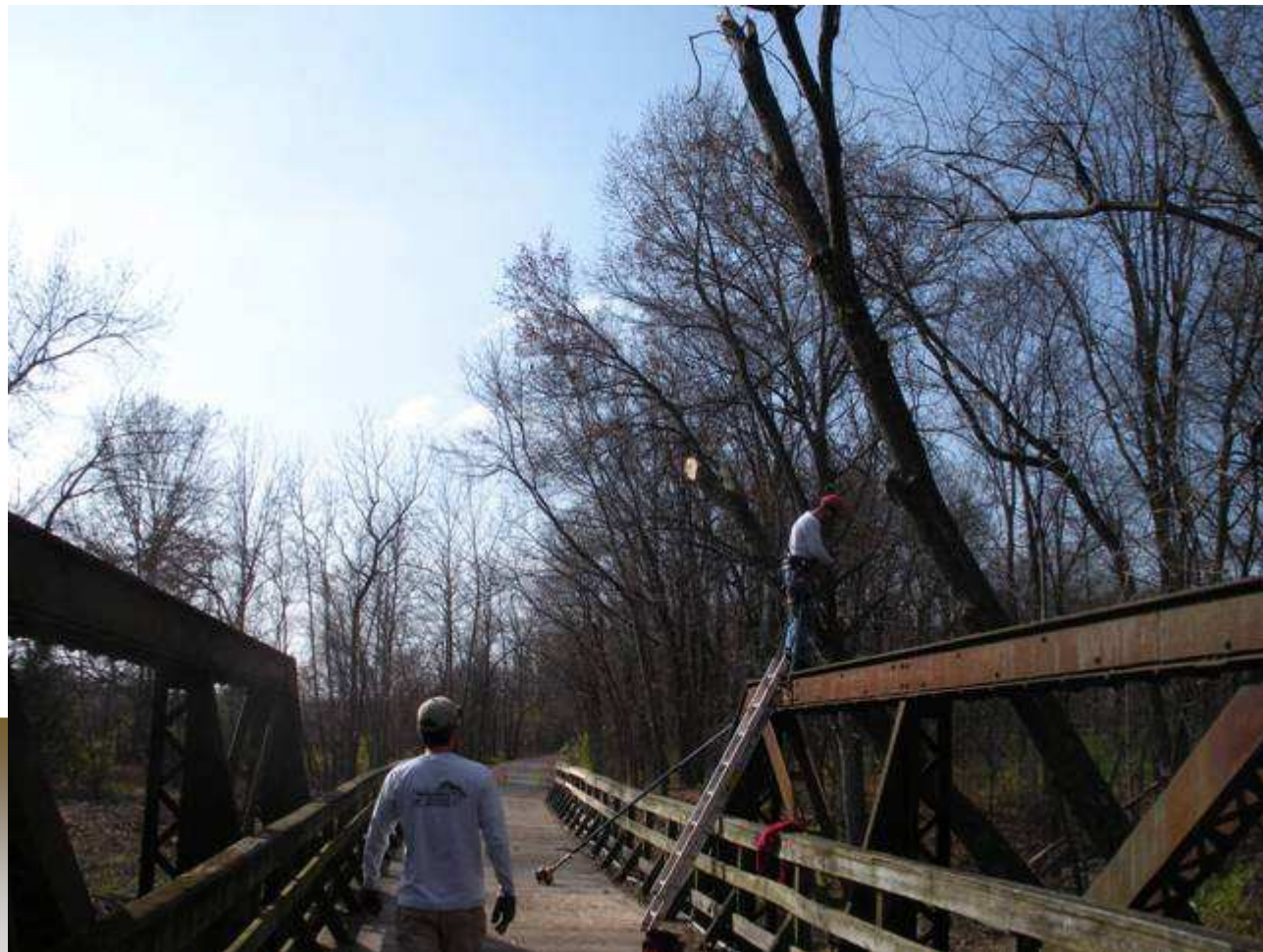

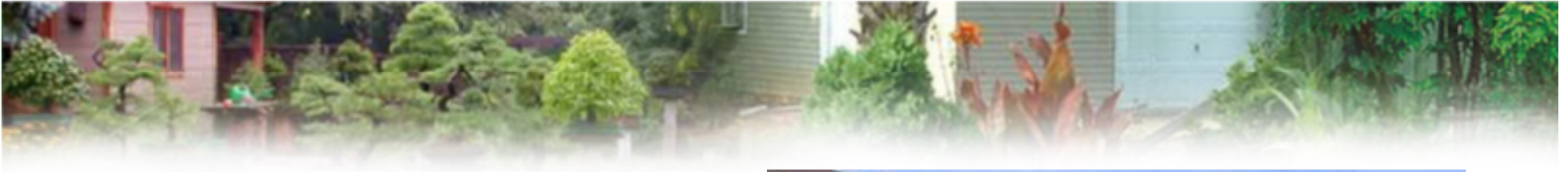
