### I. ADMINISTRATION

- A. <u>Interested Parties Meeting 3M Urban Restoration Project</u> Hosted a public planning meeting on September 28 at the ARC.
- B. <u>Hinkson Creek Trail Grindstone to Stephens</u> JC Industries has completed the non-contiguous concrete removal and replacement from the Hinkson Creek Bridge at Old 63 to the Queen Ann Drive and Old 63 intersection.
- C. Lange Park JC Landscaping completed site seeding and straw work.
- D. <u>Philips Park</u> Completed utility installation and restroom was placed in service.
- E. <u>ARC Parking Lot</u> Tom Adair Construction completed Phase I of the lot repair (concrete).
- F. Indian Hills Park
  - 1. All Inclusive Recreation completed the installation of the east playground.
  - 2. Fry and Associates completed the installation of the west playground.
- G. American Legion Park
