Missourians applying conservation principles in their homes, neighborhoods and communities.





Supporting Conservation in Our Communities



What we will do:

- \$250,000 annually in matching tree improvement grants to communities and neighborhoods
- \$350,000 annually in grants for Volunteer Fire Assistance
- Develop a virtual “conservation neighborhood” model of conservation-friendly construction methods
- Help communities and neighborhoods access programs and grants for community projects
- Assist those impacted by nuisance wildlife
- Provide fisheries management assistance and funding for fishing docks, boat ramps, cleaning stations and other accessible facilities at 20 additional community-owned lakes.
