I. ADMINISTRATION

- A. Volunteer Work - Clara Choi volunteered 10.5 hours to help at the PMC office.
- B. Eagle Scout Project - Nick Simpson built the fourth and final pedestrian bridge for the disc golf course at Indian Hills Park. (120 vol. hrs.)
- C. Flat Branch Park Phase II - Contractor (Rick Richardson) completed about 500 lineal feet (approximately 60% of total) of 8'-high boulder retaining wall. Contractor (Sunbelt Environmental Services) continued environmental cleanup work.
- D. Antimi Concession/Restroom - Contractor (Crawford Construction) completed about 95% of the construction of the concession/restroom building. Began roof replacement due to hail damage.
- E. MKT Stewart/Providence Underpass - Contractor (Aplex) completed lowering the sewer line (Public Works project).
