Citywide

- Comprehensive Master Plan
 - Completed a draft plan, submitted a report to Council on April 15, and posted draft on-line.
 - Posted web survey April 10 - May 20 to gather public input.
 - Hosted drop-in public input meeting April 24 at the ARC.
 - Set up displays at various locations to gather public input.

1st Ward

- Douglass Park
 - Pool - Installed ADA pool lift.
 - Douglass Park/School Infrastructure - Completed rough grading and concrete sidewalk construction.
- Flat Branch Park - Nearing completion of spraygrounds renovation.
- Hickman Pool - Installed ADA pool lift.

2nd Ward

- Albert-Oakland Park
 - Ballfields
 - Completed fencing installation.
 - Completed electrical installation for field lighting.
 - Began curbing installation.
 - Pool - Installed ADA pool lift.
 - Tennis Courts - Awarded bid to resurface courts.
- Cosmo Park
 - Football Field #4 Restroom
 - Delivered and set pre-fab restroom.
 - Completed installation of water and sewer lines.
 - Completed construction of concrete walk/drive.
 - Football Concession/Shelter - Began construction.
 - LA Nickell Clubhouse
 - Completed renovation of the entryway, restrooms, offices and storage areas.
 - Began renovation work in front counter and concession areas.
- Parkade Park - ADA Compliance - Replaced 40 linear feet of sidewalk adjacent to W. Craig St. curb ramp to meet ADA slope requirements.

3rd Ward

- Hominy Creek Trail
 - Completed construction of the trail.
 - Items to complete: Cleanup, drainage work, seeding and strawing, and final punch list.
- Lake of the Woods Pool - Installed ADA pool lift.
- Lions-Stephens Park - Completed concrete trail construction.

- Stephens Lake Park
 - Installed a drinking fountain with a dog bowl near Riechmann Pavilion.
 - Hindman Discovery Garden - Completed installation of permanent interpretive signs.

4th Ward

- 3M Flat Branch-Hinkson Creek Wetlands - Installed 3 benches with gravel walkways and pads.
- Bonnie View Nature Sanctuary
 - Completed construction of stone entrance sign.
 - Completed installation of pre-fab restroom.
 - Graded, planted, and mulched landscape areas.
- Scott's Branch Trail
 - Completed the handrail installation on the boardwalk.
 - Began grading work for the trail from Weaver Drive heading west to the Audubon property.
 - Began constructing concrete trail beginning at Weaver Drive heading west - completed 300' of 8'-wide trail.
- Twin Lakes Recreation Area
 - Completed installation of Little Mates Cove fencing and entry gate.
 - Completed renovation of the concession building, except for the external siding.
 - Completed renovation of Little Mates Cove water play area and restrooms. Placed in service May 25.
 - Completed construction of stone entrance sign.

5th Ward

- Cosmo-Bethel Park - Began resurfacing work on 8 of the 12 tennis courts (co-op project w/Columbia Public Schools).
- Greenbriar Trail Connector (GetAbout Columbia Project)
 - Installed a vintage bike art display for the dedication.
 - Hosted the trail dedication on site on June 26, with Governor Jay Nixon serving as one of the speakers on the dedication program.
- Jay Dix Station (annexation pending)
 - Council approved revisions to the park master plan June 17.
 - Awarded playground bid.

6th Ward

- Grindstone Creek Trail
 - Parks & Rec and Allstate Consultants staff members walked several sections of the Grindstone Trail with numerous residents, Councilpersons Barbara Hoppe and Karl Skala, and former Mayor Darwin Hindman on May 17. Allstate Consultants were directed to conduct additional survey work and hydrological studies to determine bridge types and locations.
 - Staff submitted a report on the project to Council on April 15. Council directed staff to schedule a public hearing.
- Waters-Moss Memorial Wildlife Area - Contracted architectural services for the recreation activity building.
