Council Action

The Council on Sept. 15:

- Adopted the fiscal year 2004 budget. The budget of \$237,170,292 is a 3.7 percent increase over the amended fiscal year 2003 budget.
- Amended Chapter 4 of the City Code pertaining to alcoholic beverages. The bill was amended to match a current change in state law which expands Sunday liquor sales to begin at 9 a.m. instead of 11 a.m.
- Authorized an agreement with the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission for Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) planning grants. This is an annual renewal of an ongoing grant program. The proposed contracts provide for \$123,000 in FHWA and \$28,000 in FTA funds.
- Authorized an electric energy sales agreement with Ameren Energy Marketing Company. The 3.5 year contract is for the purchase of capacity and energy around-the-clock. The contract begins June 1, 2004, and runs to Dec. 31, 2007.


YOUR NEIGHBORS NEED YOU

Air Service Update – Columbia Regional Airport

On November 1, a major change in commercial air service occurred when American Airlines reduced its hub operations in St. Louis from 417 daily departures to 207. The ripple effect of this change will significantly affect Mid-Missouri travelers. Every AmericanConnection city, including Columbia Regional Airport, is seeing a reduction in connecting departures. Columbia will decrease its daily round trips from five to two. Other midwestern airports lost as many as seven and eight departures and four cities lost all AmericanConnection service. Trans States Airlines, Inc., the operator of

AmericanConnection, indicated that if bookings warrant, an additional round trip might be added. Meanwhile, the target round trip ticket price for Columbia–St. Louis when connecting with American flights in St. Louis is still \$60-69 and will remain at that figure through this transition period.

Cigarette Litter Harms Our Streams

They’re small and unassuming. You see them flying out of car windows every day. You don’t even notice when they’re stomped out on the ground anymore because they’re everywhere – and they’re causing significant harm to our streams, lakes and rivers. They’re cigarette butts.

Every year over 4.5 trillion cigarette butts are tossed directly into the environment. They have been the leading item found in coastal cleanup projects accounting for almost one in every five items found. While the wrapping is made of paper, which is biodegradable, the filters themselves are not. They are made of cellulose acetate, which is a form of plastic that does not degrade. Cigarettes contain some 3,900 chemicals, many of which are hazardous to our health, much less the health of much smaller aquatic life. The butts act as filters that soak up these chemicals, making them a small poisonous capsule. When these “capsules” are carelessly discarded on the street, they end up in storm drains and float their way into our streams.

What can you do?

- Use your car’s ashtray.
- Carry a butt container. Empty it when you get home. (Empty film canisters make great bins.)
- If you manage/own a business, provide a receptacle outside.
- Organize a stream or roadside clean up.


Volunteer of the Month

Christmas Tree-Cycling Begins December 26th!

Christmas trees will be collected curbside December 26 through January 31 on regular refuse days. Trees must be free of tinsel, plastic tree bags, ornaments, and tree stands. After January 31, trees must be cut in 4-foot lengths. Christmas trees may also be taken to the Capen Park Mulch Site (south of Stadium Blvd., off Rock Quarry Road) or the Parkside Drive Mulch site (off Creasy Springs Road). Thank you for recycling.
