

Scott's Branch Trail

Length 1.7 miles, out and back

The Scott's Branch Trail is a multi-use trail that travels through the heart of the Bonnie View Nature Sanctuary and the Audubon Nature Sanctuary. The concrete trail winds through rolling farmland with a wooded view of Scott's Branch Creek from the boardwalk (maximum grade of 15.2% between mile marker .75 and 1.25). Trail users can travel west to Chapel Hill via the Scott Blvd. pedway and underpass (underpass may experience flooding). No unauthorized motorized vehicles are allowed on the trail. The trail experiences moderate daily recreational and commuter use with increased traffic on weekends.

The Average Grade of the trail is 3.2%

The maximum grade on the trail is 15.2%

Trail Cross Slopes Between 0% - 2.0%

The Average Tread Width of the trail is 96"

The minimum tread width of the trail is 96" (select access areas have a 65" entry width due to safety bollards)

The Trail Surface is concrete

100% of the trail is firm.

Trailhead Location: Bonnie View Nature Sanctuary, 3300 Rollins Rd.

Accessible parking spaces are available.
