

# Vision Commission Report on Topic 3: Community Facilities and Services

March 2015

The Vision Commission began in January 2009 with the charge to track, measure and report on progress of vision implementation to the community. Beginning November of 2013, the Commission plans to deliver regular reports on one of the thirteen Vision Topics using at least three ways to track and measure progress on the Vision:

1. Report the scope of **Implementation Efforts** taken to address strategies and objectives in the Vision document.
2. Recognize **Significant Events** that could have an impact on one or more of the 13 Visions.
3. Develop a set of **Progress Indicators** that will help the community see whether the 13 Visions and their related goals are being fulfilled.

**Vision:** High-level, comprehensive, responsive services---from library, to police, emergency, substance abuse and public works---keep the city clean, safe and beautiful and citizens informed and knowledgeable: provide equitable treatment to all, incorporate input from citizens, and support the high quality of life of the community.

**3.1 Library** - Access to library services, facilities and community meeting spaces will be increased.

**3.2 Law Enforcement** - The relationship between the Columbia Police Department and the community will be positive and mutually respectful.

**3.3 Public Safety** - Community members will be safe and secure.

**3.4 Public Works** - City services will be efficient, effective and expanded.

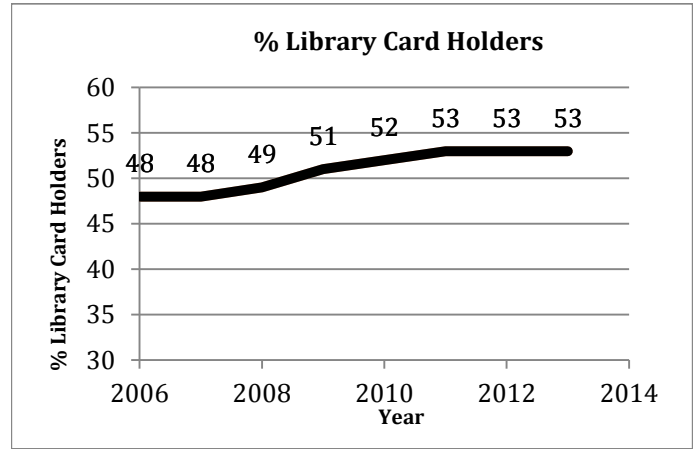
# Progress Indicators

## 3.1 Library

**Rationale** – If access to resources is increased, then the percentage of people in the library’s service area that have library cards, Boone and Callaway counties, should also increase. Cards must be renewed every two years, so the percentages reflect the active users (with a slight lag) of library services.

**Data Explanation** – The percentages come from the number of people in the library service area that hold library cards divided by the population of the area. Population sizes for 2006-2008 were extrapolated/interpolated using a 3% growth rate. Population size for 2011 was the average of the 2010 and 2012 data.

**Data Source** – DBRL annual reports (<http://www.dbrl.org/about/annual-report>) and U.S. Census data (<http://quickfacts.census.gov/qfd/states/> and other sources).

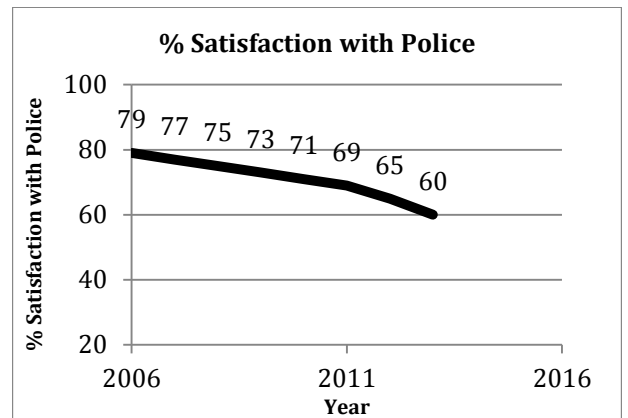
**Cautions** – If the demography of the population changes, for example, if it ages, then the percentages of card holders may not be comparable among years.

## 3.2 Law Enforcement – Relationship

**Rationale** – Overall satisfaction with police services reflects, at least in part, the community’s perception of the effort the police department is making to prevent crime and how fairly they are doing it.

**Data Explanation** – The data are from “Direction Finder” surveys taken in 2003, 2005, 2007, 2011 and 2013. Data for other years was interpolated by averaging data from years on either side of the year without data.

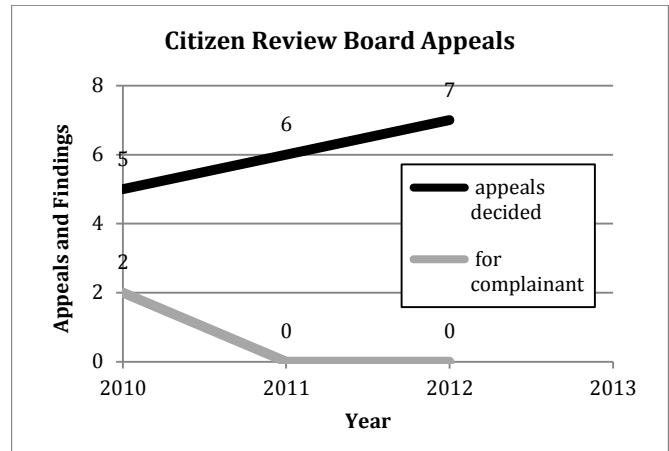

**Cautions** – Perceptions about safety, fairness, and internal tensions within the CPD or between it and the Boone County Sheriff’s office may raise concerns about the quality of community policing regardless of actual crime statistics or level of effort.

**Rationale** – The number of appeals reflects perception of fairness of the Police Chief’s decisions on alleged police misconduct and/or the case the complainant feels he or she can make before the Citizens Review Board (CRB)

**Data Explanation** - The data are the total number of appeals the Police Chief’s decisions on alleged police misconduct that are decided by the Citizen Review Board in that year, and the number of times the Board found for the complainant

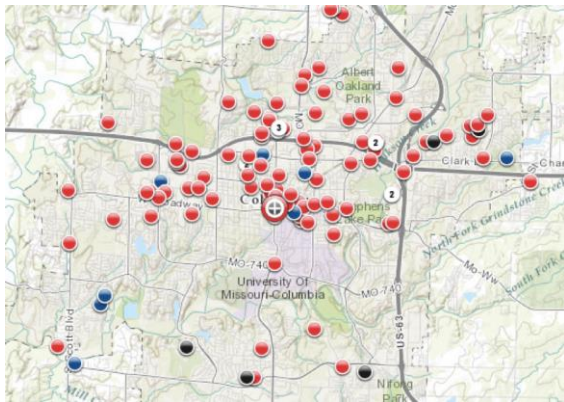

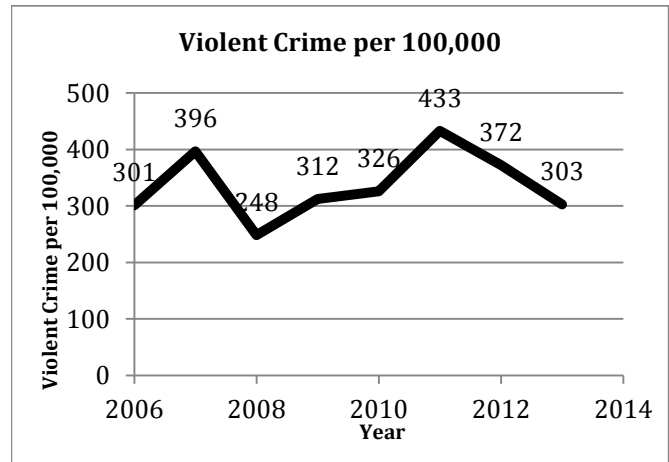
**Cautions** – While the CRB conducts outreach to educate the community about the availability of review, and provides assistance to those seeking review, it is possible that some people with grievances are still reluctant to take them to the CRB.

## 3.3 Public Safety

**Rationale** – The public is safer when the percentage of violent crimes in the community goes down.

**Data Explanation** –Violent crime includes criminal homicide, negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, attempted rape, robbery and aggravated assault. The crimes data for Boone county were divided by the population for Boone county and multiplied by 100,000.

**Data Source** - The data are from the Missouri State Highway Patrol Uniform Crime Reports

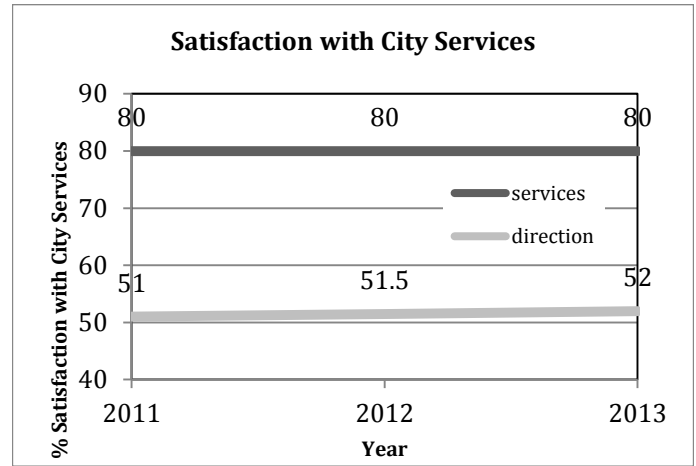
**Cautions** - Not all violent crimes are reported. Rape, in particular, is frequently not reported. If the reporting rate of crimes changes, the data may not be comparable from year to year. The perception of violent crime does not always reflect the actual crime rate.

### 3.4 Public Works

**Rationale** – Public satisfaction with services is a global measure of the effectiveness and efficiency of public works. Satisfaction with the direction is a measure of how effectively the public thinks public works is dealing with expansion of city services in a growing city.

**Data Explanation** - The data are from “Direction Finder” surveys taken in 2011 and 2013. Data for 2012 was interpolated.

- Under 2013 events the Holts Summit Library To Go Lockers opened in November not October. **(CORRECTED)**
- When figuring statistics for DBRL I just want to remind you that the Centralia Public Library is not part of DBRL. According to the 2010 census and the MO State Library's calculations DBRL serves 203,190 people—106,290 from the Boone County Library District; 52,568 from the Columbia Library District and 44,332 from the Callaway County Library District. Centralia Library District has 3,784 people in it. Those numbers do not include any growth estimates for 2010- 2014. **(CORRECTED)**

Our PR staff recently put together a handout for our legislators about what occurred in 2013 and we will have an annual report in late April when the audit is completed. I attached the current handout about the library in case that is helpful.

There are many ideas we can implement, not yet undertaken that PV sees necessary to increase library access, reach and services. This reporting action out of CV, important though it may be, would be far improved in its effectiveness if it also included some possible action steps with each of the 13 Vision reports.



Recording/reporting what has already been implemented (#1) by, presumably the individual, organizational, community and city government steps from \_\_\_?\_\_\_ to the present must note the largely organic response of the general community in going about steps to move forward actions and ideas to direct governance and/or staff at City Hall in a general direction or on specific actions. It must note there has been little to no community-wide collaborative or coordinated action or effort to accomplish the implementation of this shared Vision—noting its own internal to the Vision discrepancies and opposing or counter to one another ideas or Vision! This is in some ways demonstrated in the present community-wide, large numbers of folks disapproving of using TIF for downtown infrastructure, bringing into sharper focus discrepancies of ‘how, how much, how fast, who pays?’ when it comes to downtown (other, as well) development, as example\*\*

There are a few community-wide efforts by individuals or community groups and a few out of staff reports, when actions staff is planning overlap with some part of the CV—(again the counter ideas is a concern—as is/ was then, too the public ‘voting’ on ideas and parts or certain aspects of CV—it was tainted and this was noticed by many!)

Examples of progress are some ideas and programs by city staff on energy savings and efficiency utility programs, such as Home Performance with Energy Star and a newer expanded version for more low-income families and individuals, launched late last year—an idea we in PV took to staff, Boards and Commissions through several months of the earlier part of last year and found it to be something that had some interest or traction. Another idea is the new mass transit overhaul planned to roll-out late summer, continuously asked, to the point of begging, for by many across our broader community, and which was, unfortunately, hinged upon ‘savings’ in transit fuel using Compressed natural Gas (CNG) to fund an otherwise great program! This was highly disliked, debated and accompanied by public outrage for funding this long-desired improvement by expanding and supporting a national push to CNG, tied together with a further disturbing step to public-private partnership with this energy company, Clean Energy, putting all the risk on the public for this new fuel and thus risky public-private investment in an energy direction so many oppose, to fund this transit overhaul!

Other examples are steps the folks have taken to bring the community together on sustainability as a local-global necessity, such as Earth Hour, and Healthy Communities and the like.

## Goals

### 3.2 Law Enforcement

More work needs to be done and PV projects will help bring greater community and safety to local neighborhoods and provide food and flowers as we build greater community, shown to reduce crime and offer hope, education and health to neighborhoods.

Work with Peoples’ Visioning’s plans and goals to improve neighborhoods, improve health and simultaneously reduce violence and many crimes in the area, and/or target areas.

## Implementation Efforts

### 3.3.3 There are technological, staffing and education programs to reduce traffic violations

PV suggests we should ‘test’ whether stopping people and giving warnings rather than fines would have, and how much of, a desirable effect on reducing traffic violations with possibly improving community and police relationships as an outcome as well. This gives greater responsibility to a driver to slow down, or whatever, and be a better citizen on public roads.

### 3.4.2 Public works has more snowplows

PV says we now need to add city assistance to be sure wheelchairs at least can reach the streets, as sidewalks are not able to always and routinely be immediately shoveled like a paid department in charge. This will be important to plan for as we add bus stops, routes, etc. and keep them accessible for all, as much as possible. This will need to consider the big piles on the side on the roads that are left when plowing—if some solution can be thought of, at least for driveway areas where most in wheelchairs will maybe have their driveways shoveled and can use the extra side of the street if sidewalks are not shoveled. Maybe a start...
