ARCHITECTURAL SALVAGE PROJECT

Saturday, March 19 – Sunday, March 20, 2016



Sponsored by the City of Columbia Historic Preservation Commission, we seek volunteers with an interest in historic structures, the history of early Columbia and the careful attention to detail this de-construction project calls for. All skill levels needed, including documentation, drawing and measuring, as well as carpentry and fixture removal.

We begin Saturday March 19<sup>th</sup> with 4 HOUR shifts and opportunities to work more than one shift through the weekend. Breakfast snacks, pizza lunch and beverages provided both days.

The James opened in 1903 as the Winn Hotel and remains a largely intact 4 x 4 design in Colonial Revival Style. Contains unusual built-ins. Salvage items will be cataloged and grouped together for re-purposing in buildings of similar age and styling. (More information available in the spring re availability of items to volunteers and interested citizens.)

Selected items will be reinstalled downtown in the public spaces of historic buildings to serve as a living museum of Columbia's architectural history.
