No	Web	<p>City's failure to maintain good relationships with county fire protection district negatively impacts those neighborhoods annexed into the city - closest city fire station from our neighborhood (which includes a city school) is more than 10-15 minutes away. This is an unacceptably long response time in case of emergency.</p> <p>City sewer billing unfairly assumes all water consumed is returned to the sewer - city should work with water providers to find a way to separate meters so only consumption of water returned to the sewer (and not irrigation, etc.) is used to determine sewer rates.</p> <p>Interactions with city leaders on matters of neighborhood importance have been poor - city planner and city manager seem interested only in hearing their own opinions, not those of residents, and both displayed a dismissive attitude toward residents' concerns. Having appeared before both the county and the city governing bodies, the experience in the city is painful and depressing to go through as a resident. At least the county leaders listen, ask good questions and take into account resident concerns. Similar interaction at the city level leaves one believing the decisions already have been made, the public forum is for display and not for meaningful engagement, and residents are wasting their time and energy trying to voice concerns. I have been in the city for more than 25 years, and this is a new (and unwelcome) development since the current city manager was hired.</p> <p>The city has a massive public trust and confidence problem in both the city manager and the city police chief. Perhaps the time has come for both to be replaced. Given an opportunity, I certainly would vote against the continued retention of both. Were a recall petition an option, I would sign it.</p>

No	Web	Have you thought about increasing the number of wards in the city and or increasing the number of council people per ward? It would help with the representation in the city.

No	Web	<p>I am and have been concerned with the city policies, whatever they are, of not plowing cul-de-sacs when it snows. I've lived in the same house at the back of a cul-de-sac for 33 years. I can count on less than two hands how many times we have been plowed in 33 years. We've been stuck not able to get out in very deep snows over the years, even though the road we turn out onto is a snow route. We'll see it all plowed and dry, and the plows still going up and down the main road with their blades up, yet they never come plow the court. We've called the city many times over the years after not being able to get out for several days, after the city has deemed all roads passable, but when I speak to someone all they ever say is "I'll tell the dispatcher". And still no plowing. I've heard all the excuses made for not plowing cul-de-sacs. They're too small; there are too many; there aren't that many residents affected on cul-de-sacs, etc. When the city approves developments with cul-de-sacs, they are thereby taking on responsibility for providing the same city services to the cul-de-sac residents as they do to all residents, but we are not receiving this vital service. And we all pay our property taxes. There has been an instance where we were stuck on our cul-de-sac in a 21-inch snowfall. After four days, and phone calls to the city, we finally had to pay someone to come plow the cul-de-sac. They did this reluctantly as they said they had gotten in trouble with the city for doing this. What recourse did we have? And we had to pay for this, which I did because I had someone in my home with a serious medical condition, and if we'd needed emergency services they could not have gotten to us. Also when we aren't plowed and the court is impassable, we're denied other services, such as trash pick up and mail delivery, because they can't get to us. After 33 years we feel as though there is some sort of unwritten city rule to just ignore us. The main street we are off of that is a snow route dead ends in, guess what, a cul-de-sac!!! And a very small one at that. Yet the crews manage to get that plowed!! A couple of times over the years when we saw the plows going down there with their blades up because that snow route street was clean we have gone out and waited for them to come back by our court and begged them to come plow us. We don't expect it to be completely clean and dry, but, as taxpayers, we do expect, in a timely manner to have it plowed down to where an average car can get off the cul-de-sac.</p>
No	Web	<p>I am dissatisfied with the lack of professional solid waste management. I don't think the issue of trash carts should have been voted on by the people. It was very disrespectful to the trash collectors to continue putting them at risk for injuries and increased workers compensation costs. The problems that some older or disabled people could have been resolved on individual basis. There is no incentive for me to reduce my trash or increase my recycling. Jeff City's recycling is much better than ours. The city needs to give everyone a blue bin like the 2nd ward has. The blue bags are awful because they cost and go into the landfill, which is obscene. There needs to be more large recycling bins around town, ESPECIALLY at the ARC.</p> <p>The sidewalks on Broadway are awful. Wheelchairs can not safely go on them from Garth to West Blvd.</p> <p>The lack of housing for the homeless shows the lack of compassion for those is serious need of a safe place to live. All the meetings and studies are not enough. We need to devote public space to small, safe rooms for homeless and get serious about this problem. Planning & Zoning needs to have more criteria to deny approval for new building like stormwater and whether the project is needed (such as more apartments or duplexes.</p>

There are too many cars going fast with children playing nearby on bikes and scooters. We got a petition years ago to get speed bumps and were promised this. Is it going to take someone getting hit!
Yes	Mail	I love living in Columbia--it has so much to offer!
Yes	Web	I think that CPD needs to clean house. I'm not totally against the Chief. It is the officers themselves that have a bad attitude. I know you can't but Dale of CPOA needs to go away.
No	Web	I think the amount of city parks we have is ridiculous. I feel that the money that is used for building new parks could be used elsewhere. The parks are well maintained but we don't need anymore. As it is the parks are not utilized by the citizens. Money used for park could be used for police/ fire or healthcare.
No	Web	I think the utilities and garbage collection need to be privatized. Water and electric billing are punitive because I'm charged higher rates for using more water and power when I need it. I live in a home, not a tent, and I don't control the weather which determines how much my A/C or heat has to run. I'm sick of the city using tax dollars to acquire more parks. ENOUGH on the parks!
Yes	Mail	I think there needs to be trash and recycle roll carts!! Yard waste pickup.
Yes	Mail	I was wondering why you have raised the rates of golf membership at the city courses? I was a member for many years at Nickell Golf Course but did not join this year due to raising the yearly rates so high!
Yes	Web	I work with individuals who are disabled and I hear a lot of concerns with the condition of the sidewalks for wheelchairs, walkers and individuals with gait issues.
No	Web	I would like more detailed information on the website about what recycling services are offered in my neighborhood. We have curbside recycling, but my roommate believes cardboard is not included and they'll only pick up blue bags. My question about recycling availability at my address was left unanswered when I last contacted the city utilities. If I'm going to use the city's curbside recycling services, it should not be limited to just what is allowed in the blue bags - cardboard should be included in the curbside pickup as well. I've lived in several different parts of Columbia over the past few years and this has never been an issue until now. I've always believed this city was very good at promoting initiatives such as these, so I'm finding it difficult to believe that these kinds of services are limited in some areas.
Yes	Web	I would like to see a sidewalk in Ballenger Lane. There is a children's school and some subdivisions. I have been living here in Columbia since 1975. I am tired of the City council putting a sidewalk on Ballenger Lane on the backburner. Ballenger Lane needs a sidewalk.

No	Web	<p>I've 5 years living in Columbia total, I feel a lot of racial and economic diaspora aimed at suppressing minorities and the lower class. I am unable to tell if this is problem on behalf of the city or if it is a problem on behalf of the state/country. Less eloquently, I feel for the homeless of Columbia, I have noticed a significant upswing in the vagrant peoples in the past two years of my residency here. I understand that free housing is probably not a city viable solution but man, it would be nice to organize something. Perhaps there is an my ignorance precludes me.</p> <p>ALSO, services for the mentally unfit are a problem; anecdotally, I've a personal friend with to emergency concomitants to the University Hospital twice for attempted suicide; both times she waiting a day in a separate holding cell for space, was released without referral to a non-emergency clinic and received crippling debt in return which exacerbates the issue further.</p> <p>Also, also, as a former student and a current resident of 3 years afterward; I find the scale, price, and speculation of the student housing to be absurd. These complexes pop up and change hands with such rapidity and plummeting of quality makes the head spin and feels as if it kills local culture. Another anecdote, walking downtown and having an empty bottle of Jameson whiskey tossed at my by a brookside resident is not the most welcoming.</p>
Yes	Mail	Keep the trash pick up the same. We have enough trails and parks, we need more police. We need to get rid of the big buses and have more small vans for transportation with routes.
No	Web	Lack of street signs and properly painted roads (lane markings) make driving in this city challenging, especially for newcomers.
No	Web	<p>Most city services are provided in an excellent way. I do not directly interact with the police services very often. I have never had a bad encounter with the police -- the few small interactions I have had have been good ones. However I have concerns about minority relations within the department. I was (and remain) horrified at Dale Robertson's designation of the one-year anniversary of Michael Brown's death as "Darren Wilson Day." I know he is not a city employee but he is chosen and supported by the bulk of the police department and that worries me. On a different note, I strongly support the city's efforts to prevent the force re-hiring of Rob Sanders and would be horrified if he succeeds in his lawsuit against the city. These things are the face of the Police Department to me and they make me worry about our police department. The infamous killing of the family dog during the serving of a drug warrant was very bad but the CPD (i.e., Chief Burton) responded to it in a good way that satisfied me such a thing is unlikely to happen again. But his saying that officers hate community policing was concerning. If true, that needs to change and I don't see that he has made any effort to change that. I hope his replacement can do better.</p>
Yes	Web	<p>My biggest complaint about the city right now is how they have handled the cheap lousy housing built along our neighborhood. No	Web	My only real current complaint is the lack of vouchers I've received for blue recycling bags. No one I know has gotten them as promised when starting city utility and trash service billing. This should be addressed.
Yes	Mail	Need reflective road paint. Any time streets get wet, the road lines completely disappear. This is my only significant complaint about the city. Seems very dangerous.
