The Dedication of the Garth Nature Area

May 12, 2007



The 52-acre Garth Nature Area offers a beautiful place for families to exercise and enjoy their surroundings. A .9 mile gravel trail and several small wetland cells were completed in 2006. A fenced leash-free area was completed in the spring of 2007 allowing pet owners and their dogs a place to roam freely.

The newest portion of the trail and adjacent wetlands were funded by a Missouri Recreational Trails Program grant in the amount of \$42,000 and \$28,000 from the park sales tax. The leash-free area was funded by \$14,400 from the park sales tax.

The site of the Garth Nature Area was initially used as a sewage treatment facility for the City. In fact, a portion of the trail in the Nature Area was developed from an access road to the old wastewater lagoons. One of the former lagoons was actually transformed into a wetlands area which is located in the north portion of the Nature Area.

An existing trail loops from the Bear Creek Trail to this north part of the Nature Area, then encircles the initial wetlands area. An abundance of birds and wildlife make this walk an interesting one for nature-lovers. The Columbia TreeKeepers in the spring planted 26 trees and 400 seedlings to add to the natural environment of the entire site. The existing section of .6 miles of nature trail combines with the new .9 miles of trail for a total of 1.5 miles of nature trails. In addition, a portion of the Bear Creek Trail extends through the site.

The City of Columbia appreciates the support shown by the community for Garth Nature Area. Thank you for being here today to share in the dedication ceremony.
