EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

City staff is recommending that consideration of Council Bill 102-11, an ordinance amending Chapter 17 of the City Code to restrict dogs and cycles in the Bonnie View Nature Sanctuary, be tabled until the May 16, 2011, City Council meeting.

DISCUSSION:

Following discussion of a staff report suggesting a possible alternate alignment for the proposed Scott's Branch Trail at the April 4, 2011, City Council meeting, it was noted by Council members that Council Bill 102-11, an ordinance amending Chapter 17 of the City Code to restrict dogs and cycles in the Bonnie View Nature Sanctuary, was scheduled for a final vote at the April 18 Council meeting. It was suggested that it might be more appropriate to consider Council Bill 102-11 at the same meeting at which the final routing of Scott's Branch Trail will be acted upon. The Scott's Branch trail proposal has been tabled until the May 16 Council meeting to allow for review by the Bicycle and Pedestrian Commission and the Disabilities Commission.

Based on the above discussion, staff is recommending that Council Bill 102-11 be tabled until the May 16, 2011, Council meeting. Such action would also allow the Parks and Recreation Commission to review and comment on the recommendations included in Council Bill 102-11 at their April 21 Commission meeting.

RE: Restricting Dogs and Bicycles in Bonnie View Nature

Sanctuary

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

A council bill has been prepared that would restrict dogs and bicycles in Bonnie View Nature Sanctuary.

DISCUSSION:

As requested by Council member Dudley, a council bill has been prepared that would prohibit dogs in Bonnie View Nature Sanctuary except for the area north of Rollins Road, the Scott's Branch Trail and the trail from the Scott's Branch Trail to Fairvew Park. The bill would also restrict cycles in the Bonnie View Nature Sanctuary to hard surfaced areas.

At the March 21 City Council Meeting, options relating to two management issues impacting use of the Bonnie View Nature Sanctuary were discussed. The two management issues concerned whether dogs and bicycles were to be allowed on the property. The two options presented with respect to the dog issue were:

- 1. Allow dogs on the area, but require the dogs to be on leash at all times.
- 2. Prohibit dogs from using the property.

A compromise third option was offered by Council Dudley as follows:

3. Dogs on leash would be allowed on the Bonnie View Property north of Rollins Road and on the portion of the paved Scott's Branch Trail located within the Bonnie View Nature Sanctuary (extending from Rollins Road in the north to Weaver Street in the south) as well as the paved connector to Fairview Park.

In regard to the bicycle issue, the two options presented were:

- 1. Allow bicycles throughout the property.
- 2. Restrict bicycles to the paved trails only

As noted at the March 21 Council meeting, the Park and Recreation Commission recommended that: a.) Dogs be prohibited on the property; and b.) Bicycles be restricted to the hard surface trails.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No significant fiscal impact.

VISION IMPACT:

None.

SUGGESTED COUNCIL ACTION:

If the Council wishes to limit dogs and bicycles in Bonnie View Nature Sanctuary as outlined above, pass the ordinance.
