Bear Creek Trail

Length 4.8 miles, out and back

The Bear Creek Trail is located in northern Columbia and links two of the city's most popular large parks, the 533-acre Columbia Cosmopolitan Recreation Area and the 81.5-acre Albert-Oakland Park. In general, the trail follows the natural drainage system of Bear Creek and runs in an east/west direction across the northern part of the city. No unauthorized motorized vehicles are allowed on the trail.

100% of the trail is firm under normal conditions. Trail washout is common with heavy rain.
