#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

The Parks and Recreation Department is requesting Council action to accept and appropriate funds donated by Columbia Youth Football Inc. in the amount of \$3,000 to purchase irrigation materials to irrigate football fields #1 and #2 in Cosmo Park.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

Columbia Youth Football Inc. has donated \$3,000 to pay for irrigation materials to irrigate football fields #1 and #2 in Cosmo Park. The irrigation of the fields will aid in maintaining turf quality thus, lessening the annual restoration expenses associated with nonirrigated fields and providing a quality playing surface for program participants. The water source for the irrigation of these fields is the irrigation lake in Cosmo Park which is supplemented by a deep well. The irrigation installation will be done in-house by park staff in Fiscal Year 2011. The Parks and Recreation Department is requesting Council action to accept and appropriate funds donated by Columbia Youth Football Inc. in the amount of \$3,000 to the Golf and Athletic operating account for its intended use.

### FISCAL IMPACT:

Minimal to none. The donation appropriation will reimburse the operating account for the corresponding expenditures. Lake water is used so there is no utility expense. Minimal electric will be used to power the irrigation pumps, but since they are already running providing irrigation to other fields in Cosmo, the expense for two more fields is minimal.

#### **VISION IMPACT:**

Donations from individuals and organizations support the following goals and strategies for Parks and Recreation:

**12.2** Goal: Columbia's recreational needs and desires will be met through effective public and private partnerships that provide outstanding, exciting, and diverse recreational facilities such as, but not limited to, an ice skating rink, golf courses, tennis courts, soccer

fields, ball fields, ball parks, and swimming pools. These facilities will be placed appropriately throughout the city to allow easy access for everyone.

**12.2.1** Strategy: Facilitate the marriage of private and public interest groups to build recreational facilities.
