EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Parks and Recreation Department is requesting a Council resolution authorizing the City Manager to sign a subrecipient commitment form (Exhibit A) with the University of Missouri to collaborate on the BGREEN for CoMO project. The BGREEN for CoMO project is a collaborative research project between the University of Missouri, Columbia Public Schools, Columbia Parks and Recreation Department and the Columbia Center for Urban Agriculture that focuses on research pertaining to environmental education within our community. The P&R Department will assist the project by coordinating field activities at the 3M Urban Ecological Restoration Area with 4th & 5th grade students within the Columbia Public School District. The P&R Department is responsible for \$5,000 of the grant for field activities and transportation to the 3M site. The City will be reimbursed by the Earth Force grant for the \$5,000. The collaborative research project begins September 2013 and concludes April 2014.

DISCUSSION:

The Natural Resource program area of the Parks Service Division, in collaboration with the University of Missouri, Columbia Public Schools and Columbia Center for Urban Agriculture, has been awarded a grant by the Earth Force organization and the Region 7 small grant program of the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Earth Force, a non-profit organization, focuses on educating and working with local agencies to engage and educate young people about environment issues within their community. The organization works with local school districts, municipalities, corporations and institutions of higher education to provide opportunities for young people to engage in real problem-solving around environmental issues within an urban environment.

The BGREEN for CoMO collaborative project has been awarded a \$20,000 grant from Earth Force and those funds will be used by each of the four organizations as a collaborative education project. The Natural Resource Division of the Parks and Recreation Department will use a portion of the funds from the BGREEN for CoMO project to work with Columbia Public Schools to provide educational opportunities for 4th & 5th grade students within the school district. Natural Resource Staff will host students at the 3M Urban Ecological Restoration Area to conduct research and complete planting and restoration projects within the site. The students will be asked to monitor environmental impacts on the site, effects of the weather, collect data related to urban wildlife as well as assist with planting native species within the ecological restoration area.

The total cost of the portion of the project that the Parks and Recreation Department is responsible for is budgeted at \$5,000 and the Department will submit the necessary documentation at the completion of the educational research program in April 2014 to be reimbursed for the total amount of dollars spent for the Earth Force project. The \$5,000 will include \$2,500 for field supplies for 10 different school projects and \$2,500 will be used to pay for 10 bus trips to transport students to and from the park site. The \$5,000 needed for the project will be paid for through the FY-14 general operating budget of the Natural Resources Division of the Parks and Recreation Department.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The City will be reimbursed for all funds up to \$5,000 by Earth Force through the U.S. EPA Region 7 small grant program for the expenses incurred during the educational research project. The City is responsible for all field supplies and transportation for their portion of the project which will be paid for out of the Horticulture FY-14 annual operating budget.
