PROPOSITION ONE SALES TAX EXTENSION FOR PARKS

Shall the municipality of Columbia, Missouri impose a sales tax of one-eighth of one percent, for five years, for the purpose of providing funding for local parks for the municipality?

The current one-fourth of one percent local parks sales tax is scheduled to be reduced to one-eighth of one percent on March 31, 2006. Approval of this proposition would keep the local parks sales tax rate at one-fourth of one percent for an additional five years.

The City intends to use this sales tax to fund projects in the City's Parks, Recreation and Open Space Master Plan including renovations and improvements to existing parks, acquisition and development of neighborhood parks and development of additional trails and greenbelts.

PROPOSITION TWO SALES TAX EXTENSION FOR PARKS

The current one-fourth of one percent local parks sales tax is scheduled to be reduced to one-eighth of one percent on March 31, 2006. Approval of this proposition would keep the local parks sales tax rate at one-fourth of one percent for an additional two years.

The City intends to use this sales tax to fund an ice skating facility and a multi-use recreational facility that would include a farmers' market.

PROPOSITION THREE SALES TAX EXTENSION FOR PUBLIC SAFETY

Shall the municipality of Columbia, Missouri impose a sales tax of one-fourth of one percent, for a period of three years, for the purpose of funding capital improvements which may include the retirement of debt under previously authorized bonded indebtedness?*

This sales tax would continue the existing capital improvements sales tax scheduled to expire on December 31, 2005. The City intends to use this sales tax to fund capital projects for the Fire Department (replace older fire trucks and other equipment; build and equip new stations) and Police Department (construct training facility) and to replace emergency storm warning sirens.
