

Columbia Police Department South District Meeting

June 29, 2023







This is the presentation that was given to community members at the South District meeting on June 29, 2023 at Columbia City Hall.

Included in these slides are data for City-wide and South District violent crimes, property crimes and firearm-related activity from January 2020 through June 15, 2023. There is also information on the number of calls involving drug overdoses and mental health incidents law enforcement has responded to from January 2020 through June 15, 2023.

Interactions between law enforcement and unhoused community members from Jan. 22 through June 15, 2023 are also reflected. This specific date range is included due to the Department's recently tracking specific calls involving the unhoused.


It is important to note that year- to-date increases or decreases in the data reflect trends from June 15, 2022, to June 15, 2023.



City-Wide Violent Crime (Agg Assault, Forcible Rape, Murder, Robbery)

- Data reported by Missouri State Highway Patrol fusion center (<u>https://showmecrime.mo.gov/CrimeReporting/CrimeReportingTOPS.html</u>)
- High increase in 2021, decreasing 6.52% in 2022.
- Estimated year to date decrease of 5%. Long term three year average increase of 28%.




City-Wide Property Crime (Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft)

- Data reported by Missouri State Highway Patrol fusion center (<u>https://showmecrime.mo.gov/CrimeReporting/CrimeReportingTOPS.html</u>)
- High increase in 2020, increasing 4.75% from 2021 to 2022.
- Estimated year to date decrease of 4%. Long term three year average increase of 31%



City-Wide Non-Fatal Firearm Activity

- Data reported by Missouri State Highway Patrol fusion center (<u>https://showmecrime.mo.gov/CrimeReporting/CrimeReportingTOPS.html</u>)
- Little to no change from 2021 to 2022 for non-fatal crimes.
- An estimated year to date decrease of 2% in overall firearm activity (shots fired, agg assault, criminal homicide)

Index Violent Crime (Agg Assault, Forcible Rape, Murder, Robbery)

- A year to date decrease of 17%. Long-term three-year average increase of 16%.



Aggravated Assault

- A year to date decrease of 16%. 121 in 2022, down from 126 in 2021.

- Increasing rates of agg assault in April going from 10 in 2022 to 13 in 2023. No change in May.

Violent Crime 2020 2021 2022 2023




Vear To Date

- Highest activity in 60E, 80N and 70D. Highest numbers in April





Robbery


- Year to date increase of 21%. Annual increase of 23 to 33 from 2021 to 2022.
- Rates are holding steady for April and May compared to 2022, with a reduction from 5 to 3 in May of 2023.







Robbery (present year so far)

- Highest numbers in April










Motor Vehicle Theft

- Down after a peak in 2022 with thefts rising from 178 in 2021 to 212 in 2022
- Year to date decrease of 6%.
- From 2022 to 2023, down from 24 to 12 in May.











Motor Vehicle Theft (present year so far)


Burglary

Property Crime 2020 2021 2022 2023









Burglary (present year so far)


Larceny (*Difference between Petit and Grand is a stolen value exceeding \$750)

- Year to date decrease of 8%.
- A peak in 2021 of 1,166, down to 1,154 in 2022.
- From 2022 to 2023, down from 121 to 90 in May

Firearm Activity (Agg Assault, Criminal Homicide, Shots Fired reports)

- Year to date decrease of 24%. Estimated three year average decrease of 24%.

- A large spike in activity for 2021 with numbers decreasing from 2021 to 2022.




Firearm Activity - Aggravated Assault



- Primary activity in 70D, 80N and 60E. Highest numbers in May.






Firearm Activity - Shots Fired Reports

Firearm Activity - Shots Fired Reports (present year so far)


- Highest activity in 80N, 50W and 60W
- Highest numbers in April. No reports in January, March of 2023.





City-Wide - Overdoses

- 54 Overdoses reported from 01/01/2023 to Present, 11 listed as fatal. Highest numbers in January to March.
- Estimated year to date decrease of 13%
- 2021: 168 overdosed reported, 33 listed as fatal. 2022: 163 overdoses reported, 29 listed as fatal.








Columbia Police Department: CITY-WIDE

City-Wide - Unhoused (present year so far)

- Recently tracking calls involving unhoused starting on 01/22/23. Total of 1,028 calls for 2023. 108 incidents ending in arrests.






City-Wide - Mental Health (96-Hour Commits)

- Highest numbers in 2023 occurred from January to March.




City-Wide - Mental Health (CIT Mental Health Consumers)

- An increase from 299 in 2021 to 311 in 2022.


- Highest numbers for 2023 occurred in March.
