



## Put native plants to work


Plant native alternatives to invasive species...... 2



Red buckeye is one of many native trees to plant instead of non-native, invasive bush honeysuckle or Callery pears.



Natives provide nectar and pollen for native bees of all shapes and sizes.





Native pastures provide healthy, drought-tolerant forage for livestock, and strips of prairie plants next to row crops, above, trap sediment and fertilizers, and provide pollinator habitat on farms.



Pawpaws, black walnuts, blackberries, and other native plants provide food for people.



The foliage of many native plants provides food for insects, which are in turn critical food for songbirds.

Natives in rain gardens slow and absorb stormwater, protecting streams.

## Plant native alternatives to invasive species

Native alternatives to highly invasive bush honeysuckle and Bradford/Callery pear include those below left, as well as possumhaw (Ilex decidua), native viburnums (Viburnum spp.), and roughleaf dogwood (Cornus drummondii). Not only do these natives provide privacy, they also increase the biodiversity and beauty of your property.

## **Grow Native!'s** Monarch Café food for Monarchs

Monarch Café tags feature the eight native species of milkweed most beneficial to monarch butterfly caterpillars (larvae)—as recommended by Monarch Watch.







Nectar of milkweeds attracts many butterflies, like the tiger swallowtail above, and other insects. Adult monarch butterflies lay their eggs on milkweeds, and when the caterpillars hatch, they eat the leaves and other plant parts.

## **Grow Native!'s** Pollinator Buffet Supporting the food web

Pollinator Buffet tags feature 11 of the many flowering plants native to the lower Midwest that provide nectar and/or pollen for pollinating insects. The landscape-worthy natives featured in the Pollinator Buffet series are among many flowering plants that will help you provide nectar and pollen from early spring through late fall for pollinators.









#### Using native plants to lure native bees to your yard can facilitate pollination of fruits and vegetables.

Many native bees—of a variety of sizes and shapes—are the only insects that pollinate certain fruits and vegetables. For example, squash bees are vital for squash flower pollination, and bumble bees pollinate tomato flowers. Sustaining and increasing native bee populations with native plants helps ensure there are plenty of pollinators for the fruits and vegetables you grow! ## Choose native plants to support nature's food web & help songbirds thrive

Beloved birds—like cardinals, chickadees, orioles, bluebirds, and so many more—must feed their babies insects and other invertebrates. To raise one nest of chickadee babies, parents must forage up to 9,000 caterpillars to feed them (Brewer 1961).\*

What nourishes caterpillars? Native plants! Beneficial insects (and their caterpillar larvae) are dependent on native plants as their food sources—for example, more than 500 different kinds of caterpillars feed on oak trees—and these plants flourish despite the munching.

In addition to needing native host plants for insect food for their babies, adult songbirds also need proteinrich and fat-rich fruits and seeds. Shrubs like native viburnums, deciduous holly, and serviceberry provide fruits that songbirds relish. Prairie plants like **coreopsis** and **native grasses** provide seeds to help sustain goldfinches and sparrows.

Planting a variety of native grasses, wildflowers, vines, shrubs, and trees provides songbirds diverse habitat structure they need to nest and to escape predators and severe weather.





#### **NATIVE GARDEN DESIGN:** AIN GARDEN



- (1) Ninebark (Physocarpus opulifolius) (1 plant)
- (2) Rose Turtlehead (Chelone obliqua) (4 plants)
- 3 Orange Coneflower (Rudbeckia fulgida var. umbrosa) (6 plants)
- (4) Fox Sedge (Carex vulpinoidea) (5 plants)
- (5) Prairie Dock (Silphium terebinthinacium) (2 plants)
- 6 Swamp/Marsh Milkweed (Asclepias incarnata) (7 plants)
- 7 Marsh Blazingstar (Liatris spicata) 5 plants)
- (8) Cardinal Flower (Lobelia cardinalis) (6 plants)
- Blue Flag Iris (Iris virginica) (8 plants) (1) Switchgrass (Panicum virgatum) (1 plant)
- (f) Blue Lobelia (Lobelia siphilitica) (5 plants)

- Percolation Test: To ensure proper drainage in rain gardens, conduct a perco tion test in the center of the rain garden before constructing. Dig a hole 12 inches deep and 6 inches wide. Fill it with water and let it drain, then fill it a second time and measure the rate the water drops. If the water drains out of the hole within 24 hours, percolation is sufficient for a rain garden. If water is still standing in the hole after 24 hours, do not construct a rain garden in this location. Select another area in your yard to conduct another percolation test.
- Construct rain gardens at least 10 feet down slope from any building foundation.
   We recommend that rain gardens be 6 to 12 inches deep. If six inches, dig out the entire area uniformly. If 12 inches, dig the center area 12 inches deep and slope the edges up to the outer limits of the planting area.

#### Use natives for farms, stormwater management, & erosion control




Using native plants on farms keeps productive farmland productive and protects streams benefitting present and future generations. Grow Native! is a program of the Missouri Prairie Foundation, which has grant funds to help farmers establish prairie strips on farms. FOR MORE INFORMATION, CONTACT info@moprairie.org



Native prairie plants provide livestock with nutritious, healthy forage that is drought-tolerant and create habitat for grassland birds and other wildlife.



Planting strips of prairie plants along the edges of or within corn and soybean fields—even on only 10% of the area—dramatically improves water quality and habitat for pollinators and birds.

#### Plant natives to absorb rainwater runoff from rooftops, parking lots, and other impervious surfaces.

Directing water into the ground conserves the Earth's freshwater resources and protects streams and property from flooding. Native plants used in rain gardens and bioswales also provide habitat for pollinators, birds, and more.

A rain garden can absorb 30 percent more water than a comparable-sized parcel of turf and allows the water to slowly filter into the ground rather than run off into storm drains. A rule of thumb is to plant the square footage of your rain garden equal to at least 30 percent of the square footage of your roof. Make a shallow depression or swale at least 10 feet down slope from any building foundation and plant native wetland or moist-soil prairie plants that can accept periods of inundation.

Natives suitable for rain gardens or saturated soils include those pictured here as well as palm sedge (Carex muskingumensis), rose mallow (Hibiscus lasiocarpos), blue lobelia (Lobelia siphilitica), wild bergamot (Monarda fistulosa), Culver's root (Veronicastrum virginicum), swamp milkweed (Asclepias incarnata), and many others. Larger rain gardens can include a wetland shrub, such as buttonbush (Cephalanthus occidentalis). Or, for a vertical accent, try shining blue star (Amsonia illustris). For rain garden slopes and berms, choose low-growing natives for drier conditions.



#### Native plants as food for people









From left, persimmons, pawpaws, blackberries, flowers and leaves of violets and redbud flowers, and shellbark hickory nuts are all native to the lower Midwest and provide food for people.

For thousands of years, people living in the lower Midwest depended on numerous native plants as food. Today, many people enjoy learning about and cooking with native edibles. Fruit from pawpaw and persimmon trees can be used to make puddings and other desserts, for example, as can nuts from black walnut and hickory trees. Flowers and greens from some native plants can be used in salads, stews, and other dishes. Many Grow Native! professional members listed in the Grow Native! Resource Guide sell native edibles you can grow at home. Also, explore native plant recipes, lists of native edibles, and additional resources at grownative.org/learn/ natives-for-gardening/native-edibles/

#### **DEFINITIONS OF DIRECTORY'S NATIVE PLANT PRODUCTS AND SERVICES**

Seeds: Seeds of native plants for landscaping, forage, wildlife habitat, and other purposes

Plugs: Plants, ready for planting, growing in small cells of various sizes

Plants: Potted plants, ready for planting, growing in small to large containers; may be nursery inventory or custom grown

Shrubs & Trees: Woody plants ready to be planted—bare-root seedlings, trees, or shrubs in pots, or larger trees and shrubs dug from field production

Land Care & Landscape Services: Planting, establishment, and/or care of landscapes for homes, businesses, public places, and other small areas

Landscape Architects: Individuals who are licensed and accredited by state governments to plan landscapes in outdoor public areas, landmarks, and gardens of various sizes

Landscape Designers: Individuals who plan landscapes, usually residential and commercial gardens

Arborists: Individuals who plant, care for, and maintain individual or small numbers of trees

Forest Management: Evaluates forests and timber stands, creates management plans, and sometimes implements management plans

Wildlife Habitat & Ecological Services: Provides resource management and/or maintenance, usually for larger tracts of land

Education: Provides native plant specialists for educational events, organizes seminars/workshops, owns/maintains places to see native plants in gardens, restorations, and natural areas, and/or provides educational materials

Institutional Supporter: An institution that supports the promotion of native plants, such as a botanical institution, a non-profit organization, a business, an educational institution, or a community

Related Products & Services: Products and services related to native plants and their uses, including erosion control, stormwater management, revegetation products, and compost


