#### Administration

The Administration Unit is responsible for the overall management of daily department operations. Staff within this Unit strive to achieve goals in the areas of strategic planning, departmental budget, vital records (issue birth and death certificates) and public communications. Staff support is also provided to assist with the Board of Health.

## Animal Control

The Animal Control Unit supports responsible pet ownership while helping keep animals and the public safe. Animal Control officers assist the public with a variety of services from investigating animal bite cases and educating the community on rabies prevention, to enforcing city, county, and state animal ordinances, handling animal cruelty investigations and distributing free spay/neuter vouchers.

# Community Health

The Community Health Unit prevents and treats diseases in order to help our community stay healthy. Staff provides services ranging from gynecological/breast exams and reproductive health services, to immunizations and communicable disease investigations (i.e. food-borne disease outbreaks, sexually transmitted infections (STIs), tuberculosis (TB), etc.). The unit includes registered nurses to screen, assess, educate and promote the overall health of the community.

## **Environmental Health**

The Environmental Public Health Unit enforces laws and ordinances that keep our surroundings safe and healthy. Staff members dedicate their time to educating the public and providing services such as restaurant inspections and food handler education; daycare, lodging, tobacco retail, and pool inspections; as well as enforcing county nuisance ordinances.

- 3,128 food handler cards issued
- 2,387 restaurant inspections conducted
- 1,787 food establishments inspected (city and county)
  - 210 nuisance complaints
  - 137 lodging inspections
    - 5 nuisance abatements

# Epidemiology, Planning and Evaluation

The Epidemiology, Planning and Evaluation Unit is responsible for monitoring the public health needs of residents through disease surveillance, quality improvement and planning. The unit also addresses emergency and disaster preparedness through effective response planning and outreach efforts.

    - 12 focus groups

### Health Promotion

The Community Health Promotion Unit provides evidence-based health promotion and education designed to empower individuals and positively influence community behavior, policies and environments to promote overall community health. Health program coordinators facilitate and implement programming focused on mental health, physical health, nutrition, adolescent health, substance use and overdose prevention, and chronic disease selfmanagement and prevention.

  - 12 Save-A-Life events held



### Intervention and Prevention

The Intervention and Prevention Division provides comprehensive HIV prevention, intervention and care coordination services to mid-Missouri. Prevention staff conduct evidence-based sexual health education as well as HIV, syphilis and hepatitis C testing events in 37 counties. Disease intervention staff meet with new clients to identify partners and minimize future transmission. HIV care coordination staff work with people living with HIV and their families to ensure they have the supportive services they need under the Ryan White Program.

- 352 HIV case management clients

- 217 HIV tests conducted outside clinic setting
- 133 rapid HIV self-test kits distributed
  - 68 community outreach events
  - disease intervention clients since September 2023

#### **Social Services**

The Social Services Unit provides a number of social services including: utility assistance, medication/medical supplies assistance, pregnancy testing and support, and home visiting for pregnant and parenting families.

- 729 home visits provided
- **520.75** hours of homeless street outreach and case management
  - 455 people who received medication and medical supplies assistance
  - 175 DIVERT referrals
    - 96 Brighter Beginnings referrals
    - 72 people who received pregnancy support services
    - clients who received pregnancy test counseling
    - 17 social services contracts with community providers

# WIC and Community Nutrition

The Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) and Community Nutrition Unit provides income-based nutrition services to pregnant women, new mothers, babies, and children up to their fifth birthday. WIC staff helps families eat well and stay healthy through the implementation of breastfeeding support, nutrition education and counseling, health screenings and risk assessments and referrals to health care as appropriate. This unit also sponsors the Lunch in the Park program which provides free lunches to children in the summer months. The WIC unit, in partnership with the USDA, provides vouchers to be redeemed for fruits and vegetables at our area farmers markets each year.
